Blue Star Memorial Highway Plaque Unveiled At Visitor's Center

At some point, you may have passed a house and noticed a distinct banner hanging in one of the windows. A white banner surrounded by a red border with one or more small, blue stars. If you weren't already familiar with the flags, you might have guessed it was connected the U.S. armed services. You would be correct.

The Blue Star Service Flags are displayed at a family's home who has members serving in the Armed Forces during times of war or conflict. Each blue star on the flag represents a family member serving. Flags with a gold star recognize that the family has a fallen service member who died while serving during a time of conflict.

There is another memorial recognizing service members with similarities to the Service Flags which stands near our nation's highways although its significance was almost lost in Missouri—the Blue Star Memorial Highway.

On Saturday, May 14, Bowling Green became the latest recipient of the memorial marker.

The green marker with a signal blue star stands next to the Bowling Green Visitors center.

It honors all men and women that serve in the United States Armed Forces.

Members of the Clarksville Garden Club along with the Federated Garden Club of Missouri, and the National Garden Club selected Bowling Green as the site for the memorial marker.

Garden Club representatives were joined for the unveiling of the marker by Bowling Green Mayor Jim Arico, Bowling Green Chamber of Commerce, members of the VFW, and riders with the Missouri Honor Guard.

"The program began with the planting of 8,000 Dogwood trees by the New Jersey Council of Garden Clubs in 1944 as a living memorial to veterans of World War II," the National Garden Club's website stated. "In 1945, the National Council of State Garden Clubs (now NGC, Inc.) adopted this program and began a Blue Star Highway system that covers thousands of miles across the Conti-

ental United States, Alaska, and Hawaii. Blue Star Memorial Highway Markers were placed along the way. The Blue Star was adopted because it had become an icon in World War II and was seen on flags and banners in homes for sons and daughters away at war as well as in churches and businesses."

Federated Garden Club member, Joyce Lewis, explained the significance of the memorial and how the program almost fell to obscurity until the mid-90's.

"It was determined between the late 1980's that many of the markers were missing," Lewis told the gathering. "Between 1993 and 1995, the National Garden Club President established that all states were to restore the markers to their original status."

It was task easier said than done as Lewis would explain.

Thirteen original markers were placed in Missouri between 1949 and 1962 with only a handwritten list and short description of their location. Some of those were missing. Yet the club prevailed after finding the originals one of which was found at the bottom of Wildwood Lake in Raytown.

Since then, the originals have been restored and placed along Missouri highways and their number has grown.

Lewis said there are now over 100 in the state of Missouri.

"I don't know anyone who has given more to their country than those that have served, are serving now, and will serve in the future," Lewis continued. "Thank you very much for your dedication to our country's freedom. We are proud to be part of an effort and encouragement to recognize this country's finest."

State Representative Chad Perkins also attended the ceremony and recognized the Clarksville Garden Club with a resolution in honor of their efforts towards establishing the marker.

"The Bowling Green Visitor Center being able to partner with the Clarksville Garden Club is excellent," Perkins said. "It's a partnership I know everyone here appreciates as well as the entire city."

Don Hamilton performed Taps along followed by a rifle salute from members of Champ Clark VFW Post 5553 before the marker was unveiled.

Patrick was nominated by NECAC Acting Director Dan Page, who highlighted the many successes and advancements Patrick oversaw during more than 36 years at the helm.

"Through all these challenges, Donald Patrick kept the course and he did so because he kept the vision," Page said. "His vision was always to meet the needs of the clients, keep his staff functioning and meet the needs of the community."

The Missouri Community Action Network says Braithwait's "spirit of leadership remains strong and that the award winner is someone who 'exemplifies the energy and dedication demonstrated' by him.

Braithwait was a school superintendent in Lowry City when he decided upon a career change and joined the fledgling Community Action movement in 1965. Seven years later, he successfully sued the government to keep Community Action programs in place.

Braithwait helped found the National Community Action Foundation and was appointed by President Gerald Ford to the Commission for

Economic Development.

Patrick joined NECAC on Oct. 1, 1985, and recalled his early relationship with Braithwait in an effort to form a Missouri Community Action Political Committee. He also noted Braithwait's role in speaking at one NECAC annual meeting and convincing a national Community Action executive to address another.

"As a man who gave up an established background and career in education and turned into one of the early pioneers of the Community Action movement – that's Charles Braithwait, a man who will always be remembered for taking the time to help his fellow neighbor in need," Patrick said.

Page also highlighted some of Patrick's significant accomplishments at NECAC. The agency's budget expanded from \$2.5 million to \$29.1 million, programs were added and the workforce grew. Page said Patrick also "put in place a leadership team over the years that he then mentored to pick up the gauntlet when he left – to see his vision and make it their own and to continue to take NECAC" into communities it serves.

St. Louis Man Arrested In Vandalia

On Tuesday, May 10, at approximately 10:15 a.m., members of the Audrain County Sheriff's Office were dispatched to a report of a subject trying to break into cars in the 500 Block of West US 54 in Vandalia.

As deputies proceeded to the area, it was reported the subject fled on foot East through yards.

The subject eventually made his way to the "YesWay" gas station at US 54 and Missouri Rt. W, where he tried to pull subjects from their vehicles to take the vehicles. Deputies had already seen the man run into the gas station lot while searching for him and quickly arrested him.

At the scene, the man gave several different names and dates of birth, and his true identity was unknown to deputies or anyone in the area. The man was evaluated by EMS and transported to the Audrain County Jail for resisting a lawful arrest/detention/stop and fingerprinted using the AFIS (automated fingerprint identification system). His fingerprints identified him as Cameron J. Cockrell, 38, of St. Louis. It was determined Cockrell had two outstanding felony warrants of arrest from Ralls County for failing to appear for resisting arrest and one in Marion County for felony drug violations.

Cockrell remains in the Audrain County Jail on the outstanding warrants, and charges are being sought in Audrain County for resisting arrest/detention/stop by fleeing, identity theft, tampering with a motor vehicle and trespass.

Some of the crime victims Cockrell attempted to steal from did not wish to seek prosecution for the offenses committed against them.

The Audrain County Sheriff and his staff remain committed to working with our communities, community partners, and other area law enforcement agencies to make Audrain County a safe place to work and live. Bobcats Win Second District Title In Track

For the second year in a row, the Bobcats walked off the track with the Class 3, District 4 title.

The boy's track and field team made school history last year after earning the school's first ever boy's district championship.

They traveled to Montgomery County High School to compete against 10 other teams for this year's district championship.

The top four in each event will move on to the Class 3 sectional 2 meet again at Montgomery City on Saturday, May 21.

The men's team had several top-four performances which helped them claim the district title.

"It was a very hot track meet for our kids to get through," Head Track Coach and Athletic Director, Matt Chance, told the Tribune. "Especially kids that had to do multiple events throughout the day."

On the track, Marcus Starks took first in 300-meter hurdles with a personal record of 41.68 and second-place finish in the 110-meter hurdles with a time of 15.95 a millisecond behind Centralia's Beau Hatton at 15.94.

Ben Chance took fourth in both the 1600 and 3200 meter runs to qualify for sectionals.

Bleyne Bryant, Dylan Dalton, Brandon Gamm, and Colton Hearn took third in the 4x200 relay.

In the 4x800 relay, Jackson Hughes and Jose Soto joined Hearn and Bryant for a second-place win.

On the field events, Devin Rue pulled off a first-place discus throw beating the competition by nearly 3 meters at 45.18m.

Dalton and Gunner Bryant

took first and second in the javelin with a 48.96 and 48.60m distances.

Starks took second in the high jump and third in the triple jump just behind Bleyne Bryant who claimed second.

Matthew Jennings qualified for sectionals in pole vault with a fourth-place finish out of 20 competitors.

"In a district meet there are always some events that you expect to make it to sectionals that don't and some you don't expect to move on that do," Chance explained. "I loved the way our kids approached their events and tried to place as high as possible to score as many points as possible."

Not to be outdone, Kasie Orf claimed first in the 100-meter race with a time of 12.52. She also earned first in the long jump out on the field events.

She returned to help the women's team claim first in both the 4x100 and 4x200 relays. In the 4x100 she was joined by Starlit Ortega, Tanner Turner, and Kelley Lewis. Riyenn Brown replaced Ortega for the 4x200.

Andrea Korte claimed second in discus with a throw of 34.32m to qualify for sectionals.

Kaylyn Charlton earned third-place in the high jump sending her back to Montgomery City next weekend.

"The effort was there all day, and I was really proud of everyone on the team," Chance continued. "The sectional meet this Saturday will be like a mini state meet. This is by far the toughest sectional in the Class 3. We will approach this week with a lot of focus on continuing to improve from week to week and see what happens."

Rep. Chad Perkins Capitol Report

MO HOUSE WRAPS UP HIGHLY PRODUCTIVE LEGISLATIVE SESSION

After nearly five months of hard work and numerous negotiations and compromises, the General Assembly wrapped up the 2022 legislative session with a long list of substantive policy wins for Missouri families and businesses.

In total, the House and Senate reached final agreement on nearly 60 bills and sent them to the governor for his approval. Legislators addressed issues such as tax relief for Missouri taxpayers, enhanced transparency and integrity for Missouri's elections process, expanded educational opportunities for Missouri young people, safeguards for the rights of Missouri's landowners, and stronger protections for victims of sex trafficking and sexual assault. After months of discussion, lawmakers also reached a final agreement on a new map for Missouri's congressional districts that will maintain Missouri's current congressional split with 6 Republicans and 2 Democrats. During their time in Jefferson City, legislators also approved a state operating budget that makes record investments in education, infrastructure and assistance for Missouri's most vulnerable citizens.

The General Assembly officially adjourned on Friday, May 13, which concluded the

portion of the legislative session when bills can be passed. The governor will now have the opportunity to act on the various bills sent to him. He has the option to sign bills into law or veto legislation he finds problematic. The legislature will return in September for an annual Veto Session in which members could potentially override any vetoes made by the governor.

PRIORITY BILLS PASSED DURING THE 2022 SESSION INCLUDE:

Tax Relief for Missouri Taxpayers - HB 2090 will provide substantive tax relief in the form of a one-time economic recovery tax credit for Missouri residents who paid personal income tax in the

state for 2021. The plan caps the total amount of non-refundable tax credits issued at \$500 million and allows anyone filing an individual Missouri personal income tax return to receive a credit equal to their tax liability up to \$500. Married couples filing jointly would receive up to a \$1,000 credit. The credits are limited to taxpayers earning \$150,000 or less for an individual, or \$300,000 or less for a married couple.

Election Integrity - HB 1878 contains a number of provisions designed to ensure safe, secure elections with timely, accurate results. The bill will require Missourians to present a photo ID when





Florence 'Mae' Dameron

Florence "Mae" Hopke Dameron, 94, formerly of Troy died peacefully in her sleep on Monday, May 9, 2022 at the Elsberry Health Care Center.

A funeral service was held at 10:30 a.m., Saturday at McCoy-Blossom Funeral Homes & Crematory, Bowling Green facility. Bro. Jim Craig officiated. Interment followed in Fairview Cemetery, Ashley.

Visitation was from 4-8 p.m., Friday at the funeral home.

Florence Mae Hopke Dameron was born Feb. 11, 1928 to Augustus "Gus" and Vena Luella Marie Shepherd Hopke. The weather was very cold and muddy. She was born at the residence in New Hartford. Gus had to ride a horse and took a second horse to get the doctor in Bowling Green.

As a child, Mae did not like to be cooped up in the house or wear shoes. To kill the boredom inside, she started collecting postal stamps. Vena taught her many things while in the house; but if it was nice outside, she would rather be around her dad.

He taught her many things around the farm. She also liked to play cards and outside games with her sister, Mary.

Mae graduated from Bowling Green High School in 1946. She graduated with five other girls and two boys. High school activities included: Glee Club, mixed chorus, Commercial Club, Home Economics Club, intramural volleyball and intramural basketball. After high school, Mae started working at Starks Nurseries in Louisiana from May 1946-October 1947 to get married.

Mae joined Robert W. Dameron in marriage on Oct. 30, 1947 in Hannibal. Stories revealed that they eloped. Before and after they started having children, they could be found at dance halls dancing around the Lincoln, Pike and Montgomery counties. She would tell a story of going to the dance hall in Marling and they would take the older two children, Emily and young Robert, wrap them up in blankets and they would sleep while Bob and Mae danced the night away.

They were blessed with four children, Emily Marie Orf and Charles "Buzzy" of Bowling Green, Robert Edward Dameron and wife, Donna of Silex, Roberta Mae Schulze and husband, Raymond of Troy, and Michael Wayne Dameron and wife, Cathy of New Hartford.

After marriage and started having children, they lived in/on various homes/farms around the Olney area. When they lived in Olney, several of the children in the town would come over to play. She often referred to these children as her "Olney kids".

They were owners of several businesses including Dameron Elevator and Grain, a feed store, a pool hall, a trucking company and Dameron Stables.

When Bob would send Mae on errands for any of the businesses she would find time to visit family and friends. When asked if grandpa knew, she would shrug her shoulders and say "I didn't care". The kids wanted a barn to house their horses and ponies in, therefore they bought a farm south of Olney to build. They built a house, pony/horse barn and several outbuildings to start Dameron Stables.

They traveled to many states to show Hackney ponies to compete in county, state and national shows to win a few banners and ribbons. They even produced a few ponies that went on to win national titles. In 1994, they decided to sell the farm and get out of the Hackney pony business and moved to Troy.

Mae hated living in town.

She couldn't go find treasures in ditches, mostly bottles and jars, or walk the gravel road with their dog, Butch.

With the move she had most of her flowers moved with them, which kept her busy pulling weeds. She also liked watching wild birds, Cardinals being her favorite as well as Hummingbirds. She loved baking pies and teaching her grandchildren how to bake. To also pass the time, she started working on genealogy. When she got done with her immediate family, she would move on to another or a town or cemetery.

Not only was Mae blessed with four children, she was blessed with seven grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren and two step-great-grandchildren. 



When Caleb heard this maybe a week or so after he was absolutely speechless. His exact words to me were, "you did that? You drive all night? That's my momma! My parents! You're the woman raising me! I'm so proud of you Momma!" I'll never forget how he said those words to me in such excitement, the joy, the screaming, he just couldn't believe Phillip and I did that.

I then took that opportunity to tell him that's all I need from you as a mother. Son for you to be the guy who gets the girl on the train who needs a ride, who helps a friend in their time of need. And at the end of his life, which I had no clue God had planned would be so soon, and was about to come to an end. He was that man. I had taught him well to be that good-hearted man.
