McCune Wins Prestigious DAR Medal

To cap off the luncheon Bowling Green Regent Jane Quade then presented Charlene McCune with the DAR Historic Preservation Medal.

Fewer than thirty of these awards are presented each year throughout the United States. The Historic Preservation Medal recognizes and honors a person who has done extraordinary volunteer work over a

long period of time in establishing a historic district, preserving landmarks, restoring, or preserving objects of historic cultural significance, or establishing or participating in oral history projects, youth

Vandalia Native, State Trooper Completes Ironman Triathlon

Missouri State Highway Patrolman and Vandalia native, Brock Teague, has added an impressive accomplishment to his accolades by completing the rigorous Ironman Triathlon, held in Oklahoma on May 21, 2023.

Ironman Triathlon is considered one of the toughest endurance events worldwide.

Participants must complete a 2.4-mile swim, followed by a 112-mile bike ride, and finish off with a marathon 26.2-mile run—all without a break. These grueling requirements test the mettle of even the most dedicated athletes.

Teague, nationally recognized for his heroic actions during a car crash in June

2020, rose to the occasion. He completed the physically and mentally taxing Ironman challenge in a remarkable time of 12 hours, 48 minutes, and 38 seconds.

In his age category, men 30-34 years old, Teague finished 25th out of 52 competitors. Among the 422 men who

Bobcats Earn First-Ever Track, Field Class 3 State Championship

In a final display of athletic prowess for the school year, the Bowling Green Bobcats boys track and field team secured the 2023 Class 3 State Championship, the first ever in the school's history.

Not only did they bring home the state hardware from the May 26 and 27 event, but they also did so in true championship form.

The Bobcats outpaced the second-place team by a whopping 37.5 points, with a total score of 74.5 points. More than doubling the second-place East Newton team's score of 37 points.

The feat comes on the heels of a remarkable season where the Bobcats also won the conference, district, and sectional titles. They broke six school records, and boasted four individual state champions, four runner-up finishes, and numerous all-state honors over the two-day state meet.

"The boys and girls track team over the past two days broke six school records, had four individual state championships, had four runner-up finishes, and had numerous all-state honors," Athletic Director and Head Track Coach, Matt Chance, said via social media. "We won every meet we tried to win this year and some that we didn't try to win. We scored points at the state meet in distance, relays, jumps, and throws. This group will go down as one of the best groups to ever come through Bowling Green HS."

Among the boys team individual state champions was Dylan Dalton, who set a new school record and claimed the state championship in javelin. Marcus Starks capped an undefeated season by winning the state championship in high jump and taking second in the 300 hurdles, setting a new school record in the process. Devin Rue claimed the discus state championship, breaking another school record with a throw of 167'7". Bleyne Bryant became the 2023 Class 3 State Champion in Triple Jump and secured second in the long jump, smashing yet another school record with a jump of 22'11.25". Ben Chance set a new school record and finished for fourth place in the 3200 Meter run with a time of 9:32.22.

On the girls team, Grace Deters took second place in Javelin, and set a new school record with a throw of 139'4". Andrea Korte also claimed

second place at the championships in discus.

Chance expressed deep gratitude towards the team and coaching staff. "This team has been special all year," he said. "I couldn't be happier that these kids get to experience a team state championship. They have been a joy to coach, and they peaked when it mattered the most (sectionals and state)."

The staff, including Joe Chinn, Sandra Schuckenkrook, Samantha Krankka, Dan Grimes, Nick Koetters, and Sindy Pierce, were commended for their dedication. "These coaches had their athletes ready the past two weeks. They are very dedicated to pushing these kids to exceed expectations," said Chance.

The Bowling Green Bobcats not only met expectations but far exceeded them this track and field season, etching their names in the school's history books.

Couple Wins Show Me Cash Jackpot In Bowling Green

A Missouri Lottery player and his wife won a \$101,000 Show Me Cash jackpot in the May 5 drawing when his Quick Pick ticket matched all five numbers drawn.

The winning ticket was purchased at Ayerco, 18048 Business Highway 161 S. in Bowling Green, though the player didn't realize he had won until he took it into another Missouri Lottery retailer to have his numbers checked. Once the clerk scanned the

ticket, her reaction surprised the winner.

"She said, 'Have you signed that ticket?' and I told her no," he said. "And so she goes, 'Well, you're signing it right now!'"

He asked how much he had won, knowing it must be a large amount for her to have that reaction.

"She showed me the screen, and it says right on it that I won a \$101,000!" he shared.

Upon telling his wife he had won the jackpot, she didn't believe him at first.

"She asked me if I was joking," he said.

"I was just shocked," his wife added.

The winning numbers that night were 10, 12, 31, 33 and 38.



Standing At The Top

As with many Pikers, Brent Engel of Louisiana recently found his way to the summit of Pike's Peak in Colorado. The 14,115-foot mountain is named for Zebulon Pike, who also lent his name to Pike County. The explorer is credited as the first American to see the peak. Pike and his men never reached the top, although they tried. Engel encountered 35-degree temperatures, winds and a lot of snow. In 1806, Pike described conditions as rough and that he "believed no human being could have ascended to its pinnacle." The mountain later was the inspiration for "America the Beautiful" by Katharine Lee Bates.

strips. As the suspect vehicle approached deputies deployed the spike strip and successfully deflated three of the four tires.

The pursuit ended on Highway 161 at Cornelius Road when the suspect, identified as Romone B. Fisher, was taken into custody without incident.

Upon searching the vehicle, deputies observed the interior covered in a white powdery substance that field tested positive for Cocaine. Pike County Deputies advised they were returning to the locations where Fisher had thrown out this same substance to recover it as evidence.

Fisher was also wanted by the Federal US Probation and Parole on a Probation Violation for Robbery with a Firearm and by the Kansas City Police Department for Obstructing Police and Traffic Offenses. Fischer is currently being held in the Pike County Jail.

Continued from front page undertook the challenge, he ranked an impressive 175th, and 209th overall among the 520 brave souls who faced the event.

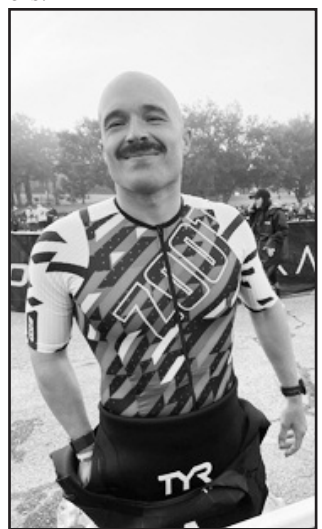

Whether at mile 10 or mile 23, each athlete has to battle past their own mind telling them to quit. That's when the months of training and determination pay off.

Teague is no stranger to displaying strength, resilience, and a willingness to push his limits. In 2020, his quick thinking and courage led to the rescue of a motorist from a burning vehicle off the ramp from westbound Interstate 255 to northbound Interstate 55, an act that won him the Missouri State Highway Patrol Lifesaving Award.

His family, including his mother Sheila Morris Teague, proudly celebrated his completion of the grueling Ironman on social media. She acknowledged the magnitude of her son's accomplishment, saying, "I don't usually post too much on Facebook about my kids. BUT! I cannot let this go without giving a shout out to Brock Anthony Teague! He was a participant in The Ironman on May 21, 2023 in Oklahoma. We are so proud of you Brock."

Teague's successful completion of the Ironman Triathlon, coupled with his exceptional service as a Missouri State Highway Patrolman, embodies a spirit of remarkable dedication and determination. As Colonel Eric T. Olson rightly stated during the Lifesaving Award ceremony, "To those who went above and beyond and are being recognized, you are a credit to yourselves and the Missouri State Highway Patrol."

It appears Teague took that message to heart, not only in his duties as a Patrolman but also in his personal endeavors.

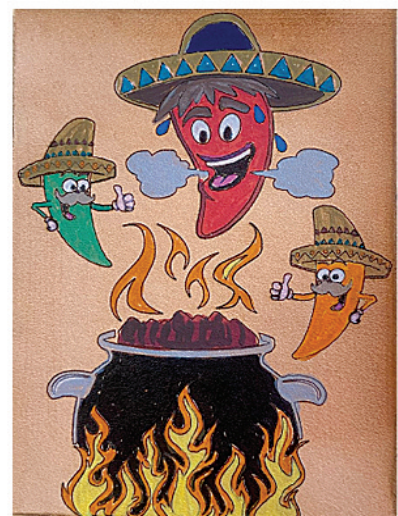

Cuivre River State Park Bicycle Ride

Cuivre River State Park will host a presentation Sunday, June 11, on a legendary bicycle ride that spanned more than 1,900 miles. Missouri State Parks will lead visitors through this whale of a journey from 1-2 p.m., at the Recreation Hall in Camp Sherwood.

In June 1897, the 25th Infantry Bicycle Corps, an all-Black unit, also known as the "Buffalo Soldiers," embarked on an impressive bike ride from Fort Missoula, Montana, to St. Louis.

Named "The Great Experiment" in national newspapers, the ride was part of a trial by the U.S. Army to determine the effectiveness of moving troops by bicycle. The route for this experiment closely followed the Northern Pacific and Burlington railroads through Montana, Wyoming, South Dakota, Nebraska and Missouri, and took 41 days to complete.

Nicknamed the Iron Riders because of the heavy one-speed bicycles they pedaled and their iron-hard constitutions, the soldiers endured conditions along the route that would have daunted even the most avid modern-day cyclists. After the riders camped in Louisiana the last leg of their journey to St. Louis would have taken them through Lincoln County near Troy.

During the presentation, Missouri State Parks interpreter Kevin Smith will be dressed in an authentic Buffalo Soldier uniform and have a replica of the bicycle used on the journey. Join him for this unique opportunity to learn about a colossal tale of endurance, strength and bravery. Camp Sherwood is located within the park on Camp Sherwood Drive; special event signs will direct visitors to the location of the presentation.

Marsha requested yellow roses at her memorial service because that was what her dad had given to her mother when she was born.

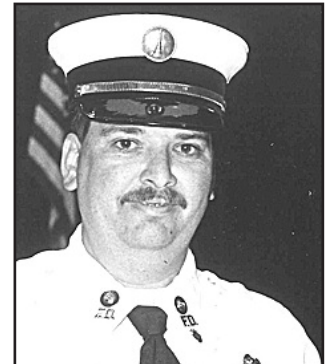

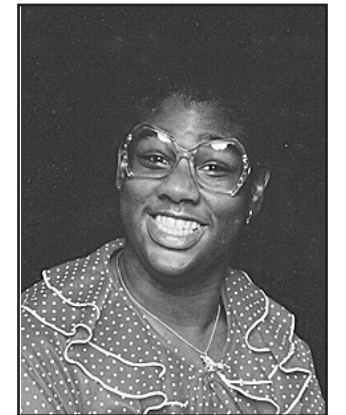
