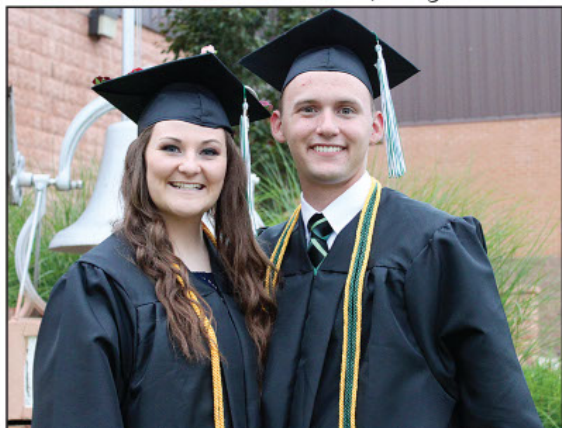

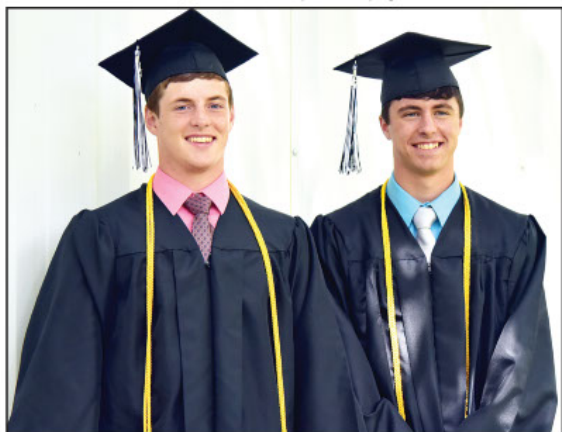

Closures Expected On Champ Clark Bridge In Early June For In-Depth Inspection

Closures are expected on the Champ Clark Bridge in Louisiana early in June if weather permits as the bridge undergoes an annual in-depth inspection.

According to the Missouri Department of Transportation, the bridge closures are slated for

Monday-Thursday, June 12-15. The bridge will likely be closed from 9 a.m. until 4 p.m.

If the inspection is not complete due to weather, the bridge crew will open the bridge for the weekend, then close it again the following week," explained Brian

Haefner, Missouri Department of Transportation area engineer. "Bridge crews out of Jefferson City will bring two Snooper trucks to help perform the inspection of the lower part of the bridge," he added.

Louisiana Museum Invites Public To Grand Opening May 27

Silver Anniversary Open House Will Feature Presentation, Refreshments

The Louisiana Area Historical Museum is opening its doors to the public for its Silver Anniversary Open House on Saturday, May 27 from 2-4 p.m. at the museum, 304 Georgia Street in Louisiana.

It will mark the occasion of the 25th year of existence for the museum and also to honor outgoing president Martha Sue Smith as she hands over the board presidency to Judy Schmidt. A brief program will be held about 2:30 p.m. and light refreshments will be served.

Those who have volunteered in any capacity over the years are especially encouraged to attend the festivities. It is because of these volunteers that the museum has continued to thrive.

Visitors will see numerous changes in the facility, including a new child-friendly, handicap-accessible bathroom. Trent Meyers has been responsible for donating a great many hours of labor for this major project.

Remodeling has been done in the Hercules Room and additions made to the Stark Room, with the

most high-profile addition being the Confederate Civil War flag that will now be a permanent part of the museum's collection. The flag was, as one would expect, in tatters after being carried in the Civil War, but it has now been preserved and framed under special glass. A grant from the Missouri Humanities Council in cooperation with the National Endowment for the Humanities with donations from local supporters made this three-year project possible. A Union flag will also be hung.

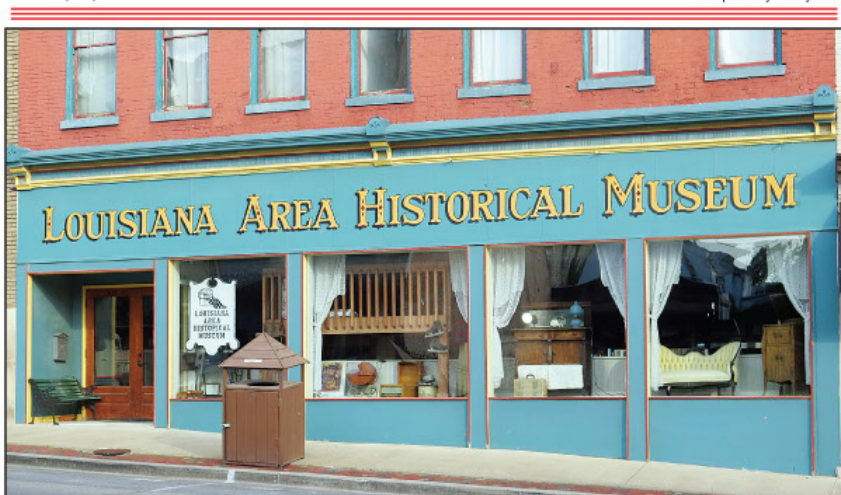

In 1992, the Louisiana Chamber of Commerce decided that the valuable history of the community was well-deserving of recognition and preservation. From that one simple gathering, where there was a strong desire of interested citizens present, the past 25 years have been a series of ambitious projects of renovating and maintaining the building at 304 Georgia.

"Martha Sue has been the cement that holds us together," Schmidt says.

The goal is to continue to preserve and display artifacts of significance historically to the area for study, education, and the enjoyment of patrons.

"How exciting it is to have seen the Louisiana Area Historical Museum grow from a back room to what it is today," Smith remarked. "It has been with great effort on the part of many people and will continue to evolve."

One special gift from the museum to the community is the summer programming "for kids of all ages" each Wednesday afternoon in June at 1 p.m. For the past five years, Schmidt has recruited volunteer presenters on a variety of topics related to science, music, history, pets, toys and games, quilting, and a wide range of other interesting topics.

"We are so glad to have the children interested in coming to the museum," Schmidt said. "When one wall was removed in making the bathroom more handicapped accessible, it meant having more seating space for the summer programs when 75 or more people are in attendance."

The programs have proven to be very popular with adults as well as students who come as part of the YMCA summer program on a regular basis.

"First Wednesday in August" programs are geared more for adults and have been added in recent years. This program is done in cooperation with the local Friends of the Library organization.

Another long-standing tradition sponsored by the museum is the annual Mid-Town Church Walk each December. Christmas programs and music are shared at each of six churches all within walking distance of each other. This is an event unique to Louisiana because of the close proximity of several churches.

The Church Walk was the brainchild of Jeanne Lovell, one of the museum's original board members.

Since the museum has no government or municipal funding, all upkeep and improvements are dependent on donations. The museum continues to sponsor community fundraisers such as selling ice cream at the Louisiana riverfront on the Fourth of July, holding an annual banquet each fall and serving a soup supper at the conclusion of the annual Church Walk.

Although there is no charge for admission to the museum, it does gratefully accept donations. The only ongoing funding the museum has ever received has been from the Buffalo Township United Fund.

The museum is a not-for-profit 501(c)3 organization registered in the State of Missouri. It has a board of directors who meet monthly and whose task it is to preserve the rich traditions and history that contribute to the life of the community.

Current members of the board include Schmidt, president; Ned Glenn, secretary; D. Randall Cone, treasurer, as well as Linda Beer, Sally Cropp, Jean Eastman, Brent Engel, Eileen Hoffman, Trent Meyers, John Murray, Ann Narramore, Mary Perkins, Charlotte Perrine, Jerry Smith, Martha Sue Smith, Juanita Thomas and Dorothy Webb. Each dedicated member brings his or her special talents to the board, whether it is in handling financial matters, presenting programs, recruiting volunteers, maintaining the building, working with the displays, assisting with fundraising, as well as "hands-on" projects, especially when remodeling is in progress. Smith, Cropp and Glenn are the only three original board members still serving on the board.

"The Louisiana Area Historical Museum will always be special to me for many reasons," Smith pointed out. "Mainly the people I've gotten to know over the years and the sharing of purpose. I owe the museum my gratitude for what it has done for our Louisiana! It has brought people together by accepting "treasures" for preservation and safe and secure housing for those "treasures."

The public is invited to come celebrate the museum's Silver Anniversary grand re-opening on Saturday, May 27 and say thanks to Martha Sue for all she has done to make it all a reality over the past 25 years.

The Bobcats trailed 2-0 after a half inning, but picked up a run on a double by Jordan Billings.

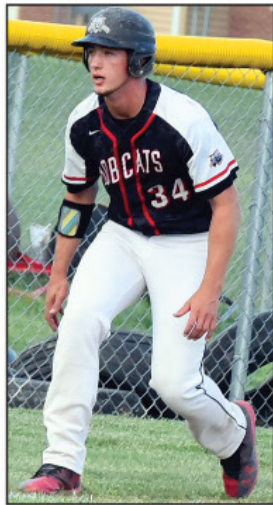
With the score 4-1, the Bobcats scored twice in the fourth, capitalizing on a pair of errors and an RBI hit from Alex Chilson.

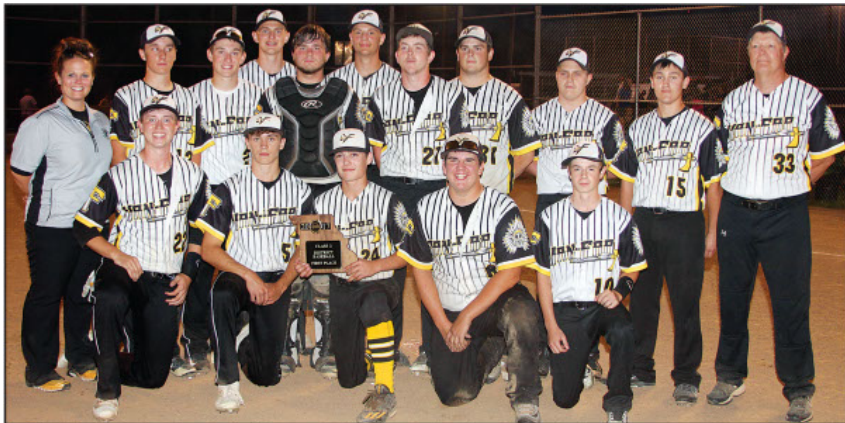

Van-Far Indians Head Coach Kevin Ballwin commented, "We knew going into the meet that we had a chance of winning it all if we performed well. I told the kids that our goal for the meet was to focus on the things we had control of and not worry about what everyone else was doing."

He noted the team focused on one event at a time.

"Many times teams get so caught up in winning the meet that they fail to focus on each individual event," Ballwin said. "As the meet progressed it became obvious that we were going to win. The hard part was to stay focused and continue to do our best until it was final."

He noted that he is proud of the team.

"Their work ethic and attention to detail is impressive. They definitely deserve to be state champions."

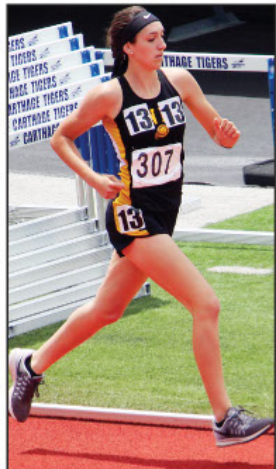

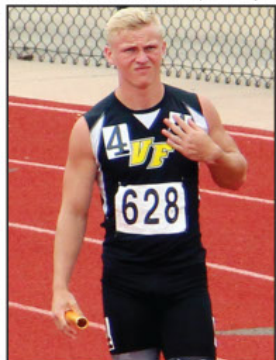

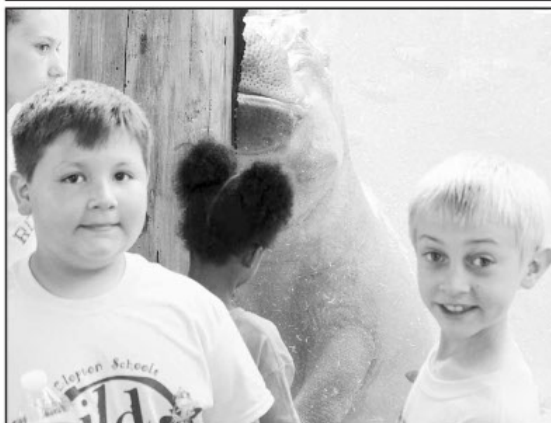

Summer Health Tips: Kidney Stone Prevention

Summer is a time for fun and relaxation for most, but can be a painful time for others. Doctors have seen sharp increases, sometimes a rise of as much as 30 percent, in patients who develop kidney stones, during the warm summer months.

The most common reason kidney stones develop is dehydration. "As the temperature rises, we sweat more and without proper hydration, the body's fluids become more concentrated with dietary minerals, such as calcium," explains Dr. Cockrell, Urologist with Hannibal Regional Medical Group. "This increases the risk that the minerals will concentrate into stones."

It's also important to know that even forming a stone just once increases your risk by 50 percent of forming additional kidney stones. "The easiest way, particu-

larly in the summer, to prevent kidney stones is to drink plenty of fluids," shares Dr. Cockrell. "An easy way to determine if you are drinking enough fluid is to pay attention to how often you are using the restroom. If you aren't using the restroom every couple of hours, you aren't drinking enough."

If you experience any symptoms of kidney stones - extreme, sharp pain in the back or side that will not go away, blood in the urine, nausea and vomiting, cloudy or odorous urine, frequent urination, a burning feeling when you urinate, fever and chills - you NEED to see a doctor. To diagnose kidney stones, a doctor will do a physical exam and may perform additional tests - intravenous pyelogram (IVP), CT scan, urinalysis, blood test, and/or a renal

ultrasound. Forms of treatment for kidney stones include shock waves, ureteroscopy, or watchful waiting for spontaneous kidney stone passage. To schedule an appointment with Dr. Cockrell call 573-629-3500.

Squirrel, Black Bass Seasons Open Memorial Day Weekend

Memorial Day weekend brings an extra-special celebration for squirrel hunters and bass anglers in Missouri. The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds them that the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend, May 27, marks the opening of both squirrel season statewide and catch-and-keep bass season in most streams south of the Missouri River.

SQUIRRELS

Hunters can pursue fox and gray squirrels from May 27-Feb. 15, 2018, with rifles, shotguns, and other legal firearms methods, along with archery equipment, slingshots, or atlatls. The daily limit for hunting and trapping is 10 with a possession limit of 20. Valid permits for squirrel hunting are: Archery Hunting, Daily Small Game, Small Game Hunting and Fishing, and Small Game Hunting.

Hunters with valid permits can also take squirrels with cage-type traps. Traps must be plainly labeled on a durable material with the user's full name and address, or conservation number. Squirrel traps must have openings measuring 144 square inches or less, for instance, 12 inches by 12 inches. Hunters must attend their traps daily. The same regulations apply to rabbits and groundhogs during their respective seasons.

BLACK BASS

The black bass catch-and-keep

season applies to most streams south of the Missouri River for largemouth, smallmouth, and spotted or Kentucky bass and runs from May 27-Feb. 28, 2018. Anglers may catch and release these species legally all year, anywhere in the state. They may keep legal-sized bass caught from impoundments and some rivers and streams all year long, statewide. In most of the state's waters, the daily limit on black bass is six. Black bass taken from rivers and streams must be at least 12 inches long in most areas. Additional specific regulations may apply to specific waters or areas. Anglers must have a valid fishing permit or be exempt.

Get more information on bass fishing from MDC's 2017 Summary of Missouri Fishing Regulations, available where permits are sold, or online at huntfish.mdc.mo.gov/fishing/species/black-bass.

Buy Missouri hunting and fishing permits from numerous vendors around the state, online at mdc.mo.gov/buypermits, or through MDC's free mobile apps, MO Hunting and MO Fishing, available for download through Google Play for Android devices or the App Store for Apple devices.

MDC also offers its new plastic Permit Card as an additional way of carrying and showing proof of most permits. Buy the new Permits Cards for a one-time fee of \$2 online at mdc.mo.gov/buypermits, from permit vendors around the state, or through the MDC MO Hunting and MO Fishing free mobile apps. Buyers can customize their cards by selecting from four nature-inspired background images: bass, buck, mallard duck, or bluebird. 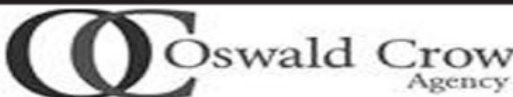

"Safety concerns and the continued deterioration of the bridge require us to close the bridge during the inspection," Haeffner explained. "We know this is inconvenient, but we are giving users of the bridge advance notice so they can plan accordingly," Haeffner said.

Motorists are also reminded that the inspection results could require other immediate repairs that cause additional closure of the bridge. "We do not currently expect additional extended closures," said Haeffner, "but there is always a possibility the inspection could reveal issues that need to be addressed immediately. The public would be notified if anything additional is found."

UPDATE ON CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW BRIDGE

A new U.S. 54 Mississippi Bridge in Louisiana will be under construction later this year. "We anticipate the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission to award a design-build contract at its June 29 meeting, which will be held in Pike County, Missouri," Haeffner said.

Following the award, MoDOT, Illinois Department of Transportation, and its contractor will establish a schedule for construction. The new bridge will cost around \$63 million, and traffic will continue to utilize the old Champ Clark Bridge during construction. "Again, more details will be released later this year," Haeffner said.
