MoDOT To Meet Thursday In Bowling Green

The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission will hold its monthly meeting at 1:45 p.m., Thursday, June 29.

The meeting will be held in the Bowling Green High School auditorium, 700 West Adams Street in Bowling Green. The meeting is expected to last around three hours, and the public is invited to attend.

Representatives from A Better 54 Coalition, the Tri-State Development Summit, and the Pike County Illinois Economic Development Corporation are currently scheduled to give presentations. Toward the end of the meeting, the Commission will take

action on the consideration of proposals for U.S. Route 54 Mississippi River Bridge Design-Build Project. It is anticipated the Commission will award the project, the replacement of the Champ Clark Bridge, to one of the four teams who are vying for the project.

The Commission holds meetings in Jefferson City for five months, while the legislature is in session; the other seven months Commission meetings are held throughout the state.

Louisiana Museum Offers Eagle Presentation

Last Program In Summer Series Will Feature Care For Animals

The Louisiana Area Historical Museum's program "for kids of all ages" on June 21 featured Karen Armstrong, who works for the Missouri Department of Conservation and is stationed in Kirksville.

Her program on Wednesday, June 21 was about Bald Eagles and other local raptors. She pointed out to the large audience of youth and adults the many features that make the eagle successful in hunting. Bald Eagles are at the top of the food chain and they serve as indicators of our environmental health. Back in the 1800's

they became an endangered species, as their numbers had declined to where they were living only in Canada, Alaska, the Great Lake states, and the Pacific Northwest. In Missouri they were only seen in the Bootheel of the state. One of the main reasons for the decline in number was DDT, a pesticide that farmers used for controlling pests on their crops. The runoff from the fields went into the waterways where fish absorbed the DDT, then eagles ate the fish and the chemical affected the quality of their eggs. Another cause was human intervention as

we cleared more forests and took over the major waterways for our own uses.

Fortunately in 1972 DDT was discontinued and the "Eagle Protection Act" was adopted. Armstrong explained to the guests that it is illegal to own any part of an eagle, even a feather. She cautioned the audience not to collect even an eagle feather. Fortunately the Bald Eagles are no longer considered endangered but are labeled a "species of concern." Missouri now has approximately 285 eagle nests, partly due to a

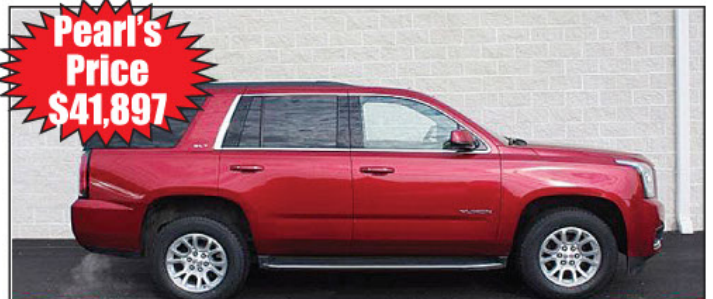

Loyce loved fishing, traveling, raising her Persian cats, raising and sculpting Bonsai plants, crocheting, playing the piano and organ and singing. She shared her love with others and will always be remembered for her smile, her caring ways, and her prayers for those she

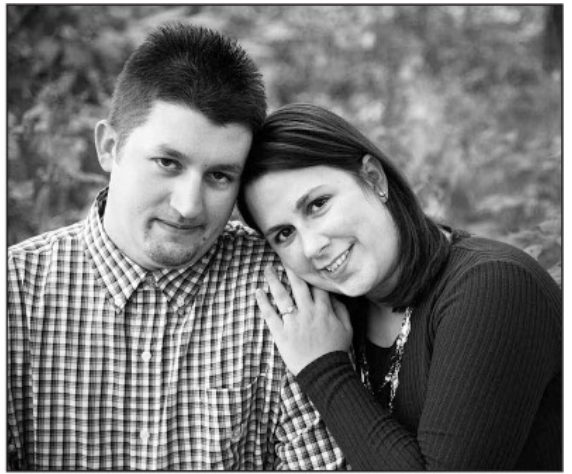

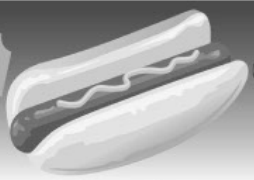

NECAC Earns National Grant For Home Ownership Counseling

The 12-county area not-for-profit North East Community Action Corporation (NECAC) has earned a national grant to provide additional homeownership counseling services in Missouri, Illinois and Iowa.

The announcement was made by NECAC President and Chief Executive Officer Don Patrick from the agency's Central Administration Executive Office Building in Bowling Green.

The \$16,857.14 grant is from NeighborWorks America, a Congressionally-chartered non-profit organization that supports community and housing development. The announcement was made as part of the June observance of National Homeownership Month. NECAC has been a chartered member of NeighborWorks since 2006.

"Studies have shown that the biggest purchase we'll ever make in life is the one we receive the least education about," said NECAC Deputy Director for Housing Development Programs Carla Potts. "Educated homebuyers are successful homeowners. Our program is designed to make peo-

ple successful homeowners."

All people who sign up for NECAC homeownership programs must participate in counseling services. Topics include budgeting, taxes, using credit wisely, shopping for a loan and home maintenance. Classes run about eight hours and are generally held monthly, but can be tailored to clients' schedules. Participants may spend up to a year in the program.

During the last 18 months, NECAC has put 67 families on the path to owning a home. The agency is nationally certified in homeownership education.

NECAC and NeighborWorks frequently team up on housing programs. The agencies hosted the Tri-State Housing Summit June 8 in Burlington, Iowa. An earlier \$25,000 grant from NeighborWorks allowed NECAC in April to open the first Homeownership Center in Northeast Missouri.

partnership between the Missouri Department of Conservation and the US Fish and Wildlife Service. Armstrong amazed the group with some incredible facts, such as eagles returning to the same nest each year and adding to it to where they sometimes end up with gigantic nests 10 feet across and 20 feet deep and weighing 2 tons! In captivity the Bald Eagle can live 50 years though in their natural habitat they usually live only 30 years.

In 1782 the Bald Eagle became the symbol of the United States as

they represented the qualities of strength and freedom. Armstrong explained that the word "bald" comes from England and is a word meaning white. Ben Franklin had suggested using the wild turkey as our nation's symbol, but the attendees agreed that the choice of the eagle is preferable.

One of the amazing facts about the Great Horned Owl is that it can see fish under water one mile away. Their eyes are as large as those of a human, despite their small bodies. The bridge over their eyes give them shade to help with better vision and the bridge also helps protect the eyes while flying. Armstrong had a stuffed Sharp-shinned Hawk on display. It is the smallest hawk in North

America and a daring, acrobatic flier. These raptors have distinctive proportions: long legs, short wings, and very long tails, which they use for navigating their deep-woods homes at top speed in pursuit of songbirds and mice.

The next program, the last of the annual June series of programs, will be Wednesday, June 28 at 1:00 presented by the Louisiana Area Historical Museum, 304 Georgia Street in Louisiana. It will feature Louisiana veterinarian assistants from the office of Dr. Patti Blackmore, Meaghan Grote and Sarah Watts, who will share information about safety around animals. Everyone is invited to this free presentation.

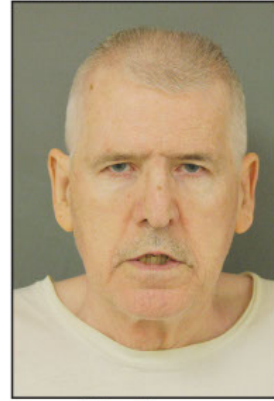
