Massman. HNTB Selected To Design, ld New Champ Clark Bridge

By fall of 2019 motorists traveling across the Mississippi River on U.S. Route 54 between Illinois and Missouri will enjoy a wider, safer ride.

Massman Construction headquartered in Company, Kansas City, was selected today as the best value proposer to design and construct the new Champ Clark Bridge by the Missouri Highways and Transportation Highways and Transportation Commission at its meeting in Bowling Green. Replacement of the bridge is a partnership between the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Missouri Department of Transportation.

The Massman Team is comprised of Massman Construction Company serving as the prime contractor and HNTB Corporation providing the design services.

The Massman Team was one of four design-build teams competing for the contract. Design-build is a project delivery method that combines both the design and construction phases into one contract to save time and resources. Hidden in the back of a narrow, tree-lined road, a nondescript two-story house sits quietly near a new housing development and just a short walk from strip malls, fast-food restaurants and

A young mother walks in, holding her sleeping baby following a recent trip to the doctor's office. A second young mom is at work, a place where her strong work ethic and willingness to learn has led to a recent promotion and a boost in her pay.
"We want them to know we are their

safety net," said Carissa Figgins, The Sparrow's Nest executive director and founder.

Several miles away in a rural area between Weldon Spring and Defiance, a toddler walks down the hallway of what used to be an assisted living facility and into a playroom. Her mother is nearby, smiling as her child grabs plastic food for visitors.

"We want it to feel like home," said Peggy Forrest, Our Lady's Inn executive director

Indeed, this is home — and a chance to get on a path for a brighter future.

Both The Sparrow's Nest and Our Lady's Inn are maternity homes and a safe haven for homeless, pregnant or parenting mothers who in many instances have nowhere else to turn.

Both non-profit organizations are located in St. Charles County. Each were recipients of \$5,000 "Sharing Success" grants from Cuivre River Electric Cooperative and financial part-CoBank of Denver, Colo. Funds will be used to continue providing housing outreach for homeless moth-

ers and their children. Cuivre River Electric and CoBank each contributed \$5,000

"Serving our community is a core cooperative principle. The Cuivre River Board of Directors takes this responsi-bility seriously," said Ted House, Cuivre River Electric board member. "It is with great joy that we are able to contribute to the mission of Sparrow's Nest and Our Lady's Inn maternity homes. These fabulous organizations not only change lives, they save lives. They a real and lasting difference through love, compassion and discipline by promoting the sanctity of human life

The Sparrow's Nest welcomes teenage mothers who are pregnant or have a child under the age of 5. Since 2013, staff and volunteers have helped more than 60 teenage moms and their children, most from the local region. The shelter is licensed to house up to eight children, or any combination of moms and their babies.

Our Lady's Inn opened the St. Charles County facility in 2006 to provide shelter and care for homeless moms residing in Lincoln, Pike, St. Charles and Warren counties. It can accommodate up to 12 mothers age 18 and older, and their children. The organization also operates a shelter in St. Louis. Since 1982, Our Lady's Inn has helped more than 6,000 mothers.

The mothers can stay up to a year at both maternity homes. During that time, they will be provided resources to help them transition to independent liv-

are required to attend school or GED courses. If they have a diploma, some form of post-secondary education is expected of them.

"We have a choice to not give up on teenagers," Figgins said. "We know we've had an impact. There is no udgement, there is no hand slapping. We are proud of what we do.

Older mothers at Our Lady's Inn are

tasked to assist with household chores at the shelter in addition to gaining employment. Two years of support also is offered to each family when they ave one of their two facilities.

MDC Reminds People To Celebrate Safely

As people celebrate this summer, the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds everyone to be extremely careful with fireworks, campfires, and other sources of fire that could cause a wildfire.

FIREWORKS

Don't light fireworks in any areas where the sparks could ignite dry grass, leaves, or other potential fire fuel. Always have an approved fire extinguisher and an available water supply to douse sparks or flames. Wet the area around where fireworks are being discharged. Check with local ordinances and authorities for bans on fireworks and open burning

OUTDOOR BURNING

Don't burn during wrong con-ditions. Dry grass, high tempera-tures, low humidity, and wind make fire nearly impossible to control. Check with local fire departments regarding burn bans that may be in place. A person who starts a fire for any reason is responsible for any damage it may

DRIVING OFF ROAD

Wildfires can start when dry fuel, such as grass, comes in contact with catalytic converters.

Think twice before driving into and across a grassy field. Never park over tall, dry grass or piles of leaves that can touch the underside of a vehicle. When driving

Clear a generous zone around fire rings. Store unused firewood a good distance from a campfire. Never use gasoline, kerosene, or other flammable liquid to start a fire. Keep campfires small and controllable. Keep fire-extinguishing materials, such as a rake, shovel, and bucket of water, close Extinguish campfires each night and before leaving camp, even if it's just for a few moments.

Call 911 at the first sign of a

fire getting out of control.

REPORT FOREST ARSON

Wildfires are sometimes set by vandals. Help stop arson by calling 800-392-1111 and reporting potential arson activities Callers will remain anonymous

and rewards are possible. MANAGED FIRE

Fire used in the wrong way can create disasters. Used in the right way, fire can help create habitat for wildlife. For more information on using prescribed fire as a landmanagement mdc.mo.gov/prescribedfire.

Sunny With A Chance Of Heat Strok

Each year many Missourians suffer from heat related illnesses, with some cases resulting in death.

Who is at risk? The elderly, infants and young children, people working outdoors, people living with chronic medical conditions, the homeless and the poor, people taking certain medications, and athletes are most at risk for heat related illnesses.

Take precautions:

Spend time in an air conditioned place. Check on family, friends and neigh-bors, especially the elderly.

Limit outdoor activity, wear sunglasses, hats, light weight and light colored clothing and sunscreen.

Avoid using the stove or oven to cook. Don't leave children or animals in parked cars

Schedule activities early in the day or late in the evening.

Drink lots of caffeine-free, non-alco-

holic and non-sugary beverages. Take cool showers or baths. Don't use recreational drugs. They

impair judgment and the body's response to temperatures.

Take care of animals, they are also

susceptible to the heat.

Certain types of medications can increase the risk of temperature related illnesses, such as:

Heat Stroke - is the most serious heat related illness. It occurs when the body is unable to control its temperature. The body loses its ability to sweat and cannot cool down. It can cause death or perma-nent disability if emergency treatment is not provided. Warning signs: High body temperature-above 103

Convulsions

Dizziness No sweating (red, hot and dry skin)

Nausea

Tingling sensations Confusion

Throbbing headache
What to do: call 911 or emergency room for instructions; move to cool place; lie flat and elevate feet; do not give fluids by mouth; immerse in cool (not cold) water or sponge with cool water and fan vigorously; monitor body temperature and continue cooling efforts until temperature drops to 101-102F.







selected to build the new Champ Clark Bridge and look forward to a good working relationship with the team and the region, said Mark Schnoebelen, Vice President of Massman Construction
Company. "We know our work
will not only impact local folks
who travel in the area, but all
motorists who cross the Mississippi River here," he added.
"We're committed to building a quality bridge at a good value as quickly as possible," he conclud-

The Massman Team's goal is to subcontract 12 percent of the construction and 16 percent of the professional and design activities Disadvantaged Business Enterprise companies. Federal workforce goals also require that 3.1 percent of those working on the project are minorities and 6.9 percent are female. "We had the opportunity to connect the teams with DBEs this year, as well as provide a job fair last fall for anyone interested in potentially work-ing on the new bridge," said Keith Killen, project director of the Champ Clark Bridge and a profes-sional engineer with MoDOT. He added the team and MoDOT will work together to host another job fair later this summer.

The next step in the design-build process is for the Massman Team is to fine-tune its design plans. When those are complete, MoDOT will hold a public meeting to share the final scope of work, including proposed renderings of the new bridge.

The Massman Team plans to begin construction this fall and have the bride open to traffic by the Fall of 2019. A groundbreak-ing ceremony will be held later this fall.

The Champ Clark Bridge name is expected to stick with the new bridge. It was named for former presidential candidate and Speaker of the House James Beauchamp Clark, who also served as assistant prosecuting attorney in Pike County for 26
