MDC Invites Explorers To Discover Unique **Rock Tunnel Sculpted By Water Near Whiteside**



The Sandy Creek Natural Tunnel is located near the town of Whiteside in Lincoln County. It is accessible for exploration thanks to the Missouri Outdoor Recreational Access Program (MRAP)

It's something you might not expect to come upon while hiking to a serene Missouri creek. But there it is—a 50-foot domed cliff of stone. Looming over the creek it paints a shimmering reflection on the pool below. Through the rock stretches a tunnel, 12 feet wide and 16 feet tall, carved clean through by nothing more than the force of water. Light from the tunnel's opposite opening shines like a beacon, an invitation for further

exploration.
You've just discovered the
Sandy Creek Natural Tunnel.
This marvel is one of

Missouri's Natural Areas, loca-tions designated statewide because of their outstanding natural qualities or features. The area is located just west of the town of Whiteside in Lincoln County and is enrolled in the Missouri Department of Conservation's Missouri Outdoor

Recreational Access Program (MRAP). MRAP is a cooperative effort between MDC and willing landowners to offer private land for public access to hunt, fish or view wildlife.

Sandy Creek Tunnel property is enrolled in the MRAP Program as a wildlife and nature viewing site. Fishing and hunting are not permitted. The area is open daily from an hour before sunrise until an hour past sunset. Sandy Creek, which skirts the area's eastern boundary, flows into the North Fork of the Cuivre River. It is clear with a bottom of sand and gravel.

Upon arriving, visitors can park on a small grassy patch at the entrance in front of the wooden MRAP bulletin board. Guests are encouraged to fill out a use card to help MDC track visitation to the

money above market price of each animal goes back to the premium account. Each exhibitor in the inside exhibits and livestock are paid a premium on their exhibit. Any individual, business or group

of individuals or businesses may purchase an animal.







Missouri FFA Members To Sponsor Service Day On Aug. 15 This Year

Living to serve, 400 Missouri FFA members will participate in the first Missouri FFA Food Insecurity Service Day Aug. 15, 2017, at the Missouri State Fair. The service day, held in conjunction with Missouri Farmers Care's Drive to Feed Kids, will see FFA members pack 50,000 child-friendly meals. The Missouri FFA organization is coordinating the event to provide an opportunity for FFA members to visit the fair and experience the true meaning of the fourth line of the FFA Motto, "I kinn to serve".

"The vision of the FFA is Growing Leaders, Building Communities and Strengthening Agriculture," said Abby Bertz, state FFA president. "We are excited for this partnership as we put into action the components of our vision - members working together, developing as leaders, building a sense of community and partnering with Missouri agriculture - all while working to fight hunger right here in our home state."

The FFA Food Insecurity Service Day is part of Missouri Farmers Care's Drive to Feed Kids, a coordinated effort to combat childhood food insecurity and showcase Missouri agriculture. The Drive is raising financial support for Feeding Missouri, the network of Missouri's six regional food banks, supporting 1,500 food pantries. All money raised through the Drive will fund existing programs to deliver kid-friendly meals to hungry children across Missouri. The Drive is led by Missouri Farmers Care, Brownfield Ag News, Monsanto, Feeding Missouri, the Missouri State Fair and Missouri FFA.

"Sadly, even in the nation's agricultural heartland, hunger is a challenge," said Ashley McCarty, executive director of Missouri Farmers Care. "Missouris rate of childhood food insecurity is among the highest in the nation. In communities throughout the state, as many as 1 in 5 people face food insecurity. Among children, the numbers are even higher. In parts of Missouri, 1 in 3 children face food insecurity on a regular basis. The Drive to Feed Kids is working to provide food to help these children thrive."

The Missouri FFA Food Insecurity Service Day, Tuesday, Aug. 15, will begin with a motivational message from past Missouri FFA State Officer Cody Jones. Afterwards, FFA members will begin packing 50,000 kid-friendly meals for the Food Bank of Central and Northeast Missouri. FFA members will also be receiving canned food donations at the Centennial Gate for Missouri Farmers Care Food Drive Tuesday. On this day, fairgoers receive discounted admission for canned food donations (\$1 off per item, up to \$5 savings per adult ticket) for gate admission. Missouri FFA is partnering with Missouri Farmers Care, the Missouri State Fair, and Meals of Hoce on this project.

Fair, and Meals of Hope on this project. Paired with the Drive to Feed Kids is the opportunity to celebrate agriculture's productivity and contributions while responsibly producing food for our communities. In addition to the FFA Food Insecurity Service Day, key Drive events at the Missouri State Fast Lair include a screening of "Where the Fast Lane Ends*, a film showing the responsible use of agricultural science and technology. The screening will be hosted on Thursday, Aug. 10 at 3:30 p.m. in the Director's Tent. Pairs of tickets are available for a minimum donation of \$25 to the Drive.

From there a dirt road path leads hik ers eastward. Within a quarter mile visi tors will come to the edge of an open field on their right. At this point hikers have two options, allowing them to explore the tunnel from different perspectives by tak-ing either or both. Paths are not marked however, so visitors are encouraged to download the area map for reference at

https://goo.gl/Y8wxRL. Option one is leaving the dirt road and following the path to the right, or south, along the edge of the field. This takes hikers on a 20 minute walk that meanders through open field and patches of woods. Hikers should note that the trip woods. Hikers should note that the trip involves crossing Sandy Creek and will likely get their feet wet, so they should plan accordingly. But the destination is worth the walk—the bank of the creek and a commanding view of the natural tunnel from across the water. The impressive feature was sculpted from Burlington, limestone when a stream Burlington limestone when a stream branch took an underground shortcut to Sandy Creek. It looks its best in morning light. To return, hikers should double

back the way they came.

The other option is to continue straight on the dirt road, heading east.

This will bring hikers to the top of the natural tunnel and the open glade that cov-

ers it. Signs mark the start and end of the tunnel. The natural tunnel itself is not very apparent from this vantage point. However there is the opportunity for scenic views of the creek from this elevation, and a chance to explore the glade that forms the "roof" of the tunnel. A small path just before the first sign leads down to the tunnel itself, and brings visitors to the its opening opposite the one viewed from the creek described above. Again, visitors should back track to return to their vehicles.

To reach the Sandy Creek Natural Tunnel, follow MO Z west from Whiteside approximately six miles. Turn right onto MO HH, and then go north 0.1 miles. Turn right into private drive and park near the bulletin board. 




