Louisiana School Board Votes To Move Forward On Plan To Join EMO Conference

Louisiana R-II Superintendent Dr. Todd Smith reports the school board voted 6-1 in favor of a proposal to leave the Clarence Cannon Conference and join the EMO Conference.

Smith explained the district had received an invitation from the EMO Conference after Community R-VI announced it will be departing from the conference. Smith pointed out the discussion wouldn't even have come up in the conference had not

reached out to them.

While the issue has been shot down before, there are a number of factors that have persuaded many to have a change of heart.

The biggest issue to staying in the Clarence Cannon Conference is the geography. The conference keeps moving away from Louisiana. Several schools require a four-hour round trip drive. That is hard for students and parents as well as being costly at a time where every penny counts.

Car Crash Claims Life Of BGHS Senior Nicholas Spencer

A car crash claimed the life of a Bowling Green High School senior, 18-year-old Nicholas L. Spencer on Saturday night.

Spencer was a passenger in the vehicle. The driver, 32-year-old Jeffery W. Holden of Bowling Green, sustained serious injuries. He was taken to St. Joseph

Hospital in St. Charles by Lincoln County ambulance.

Another passenger, 17-year-old James S. Ortega of Bowling Green, sustained minor injuries and was taken to Mercy Hospital by Lincoln County EMS.

According to the report by the

Michael Black Faces Murder Charge For Shooting Stepson Following Fight

Michael Allan Black, 60, has been charged with first degree murder and armed criminal action after allegedly shooting and killing his 31-year-old stepson on Saturday night.

Alexander Koch was shot once in the abdomen. He was taken to Pike County Memorial Hospital but died a short time later at 11:30 p.m.

According to the probable cause statement, the Pike County Sheriff's Department received a call from one of three juvenile children in the house to report that his parents were fighting and his "uncle" was laying on the floor. During the call Koch's mother, Janet Black, took the phone and reported that her son had been shot in the stomach by her husband. Deputies responded to the

residence just off of Highway Y at about 10:30 p.m.

Deputy William Harrison reported hearing one of the juvenile children yell, "Grandpa put the gun down the police are here."

Harrison said Black was found standing on a patio table smoking a cigarette and the .357 Smith & Wesson revolver was placed in the back waistline of his pants.

Sheriff Stephen Korte said that Black and Koch had been in a physical altercation earlier in the night. Koch had left the residence but returned just 15 minutes later. Shortly after that is when Black is accused of shooting his stepson in the stomach. He reportedly told law enforcement that he was tired of being beaten up.

Korte said the department has responded to the home previously.

He added he wasn't sure if they were for domestic disturbance.

Registration will be from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Anyone wishing to drive their vehicle in the parade will need to be at the Bowling Green High School by 9:30 p.m.

The car and truck show will have 16 different categories with multiple awards in each. A total of 70 vehicles will be selected by car show workers for awards to be

presented at 3 p.m.

Hot wheel races will be available for the kids. The Route 66 Corvette Club has indicated that they plan to attend again this year.

Everyone entering the show will receive a dash plaque featuring Tom and Eva Craig's beautiful fire red 2003 Ford Mustang SVT Cobra convertible. The Mustang is powered by a supercharged 4.6 cubic inch 32 valve terminator cobra engine backed by a manual six speed transmission with the independent rear suspension.

The car has a great sound with a screaming supercharger and a Borla performance exhaust. Since owning the car, Tom has made numerous subtle additions including new head lights, aftermarket cold air intake, bigger exhaust, billet radiator cover and chrome hood hangers. He has painted underneath the hood, belt covers, bumper, intercooler and brake rotors. The Mustang is driven, having made trips to St. Louis and Kansas City. Through

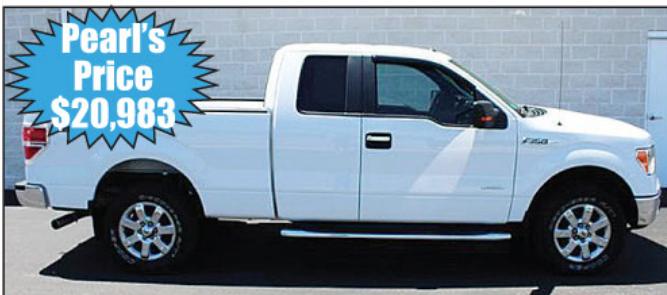

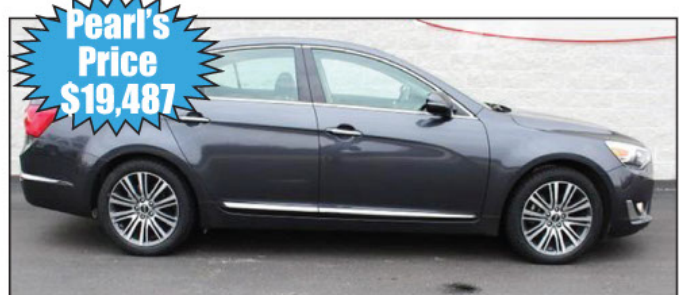

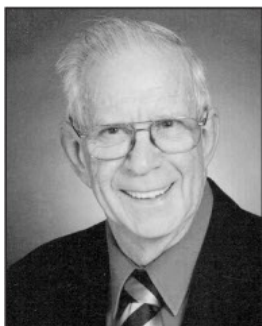

A second half comeback by Louisiana had Bulldogs fans thinking victory, but the Clopton-Elsberry IndianHawks had a final push for a 44-38 win in the first week of gridiron action.

Clopton-Elsberry scored on their first two possessions as junior back Eli Ankleman broke loose for a 43-yard score just over two minutes into play, then Shawn Yates connected with Maleek McPike for a 28-yard pass for a 14-0 lead just 8:15 into the first quarter.

Clopton-Elsberry was sent reeling in the second quarter when All-Conference lineman Jameson Wolanski was lost for the night with a knee injury.

The Bulldog defense put Louisiana on the board, catching Clopton-Elsberry in their own endzone for a safety.

After the free kick, the IndianHawks defense increased the lead when Trevor Anthony picked off a Dalton Oberhaus pass, returning the ball 28 yards for a touchdown.

The Louisiana offense found a spark late in the second quarter as Michael Francis hauled in a short pass from Oberhaus and scored from 40 yards out to make the score 20-10 after a two-point conversion.

The Bulldogs would get the ball again before the half and with just 28 seconds remaining before

the break Oberhaus scored from seven yards out to cut the deficit to just four points.

Clopton-Elsberry grabbed another touchdown early in the third quarter when Yates broke free for 37 yards and a score.

With the score 26-16 the Bulldogs attack went to work.

Cody Love brought down a touchdown pass with 4:13 to go in the third to again cut the IndianHawks lead to just four.

On the ensuing kick-off, Clopton-Elsberry had a momentary lapse in judgement and let the kick go. The Bulldogs fell on the loose ball, gaining possession inside the five yard line. Zac Harrison scored on the next play and the Bulldogs added the two point try for a 30-26 lead.

The IndianHawks battled back before the end of the third quarter, taking a 32-30 lead on a six yard sneak by Shawn Yates, his second rushing score of the game.

Oberhaus capped a fourth quarter opening drive with a one yard score for Louisiana. Again the Bulldogs converted the two point attempt for a six point lead.

The fourth quarter lead was the first for the rebuilding Bulldogs in the last three seasons.

The IndianHawks were able to answer again. They tied the game when Yates hooked up with top target Blake Kendall for a 76-yard touchdown.

Both teams had their chances as the fourth quarter wore on, but those in attendance and watching on TribCAST knew this game would not reach overtime.

As the final minute ticked away, the IndianHawks moved to the red zone. In the final fifteen seconds Yates dropped back and found his target. The sophomore connected with senior Matt Klopcic for a 27-yard TD to put away the Bulldogs by six points.

IndianHawks Coach Mike Scheibel was quick to throw accolades toward the opposition following the game, "That (Louisiana) is a good team!" He added, "They are going to beat somebody this season." Scheibel was relieved that somebody wasn't his IndianHawks.

Community State Bank TribCAST Player of the Game Shawn Yates was happy with the win, but noted there is a lot of work still to come.

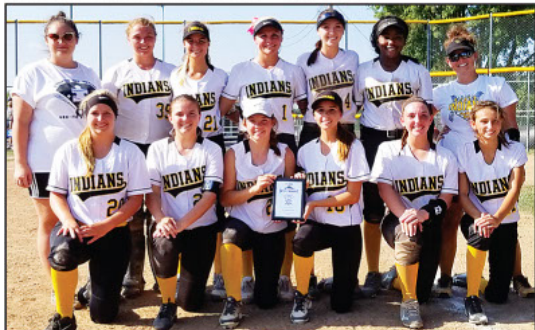
Yates finished week one with 208 passing yards on 9 of 18 completions, tossing three touch-

Korte said Black had been drinking alcohol over the course of the evening. Black told deputies that Koch had hit him numerous times with a skateboard. Black had a head wound that was bleeding when deputies

arrived at the scene.

Deputies noted that Black retrieved the gun from a bedroom on the far northeast side of the residence during the time Koch had left the home.

Chief Deputy Josh Baker noted in the probable cause statement that Black passed by two phones from the garage to the bedroom that could have been used to call 911. Baker also noted that Black

did not attempt to provide any kind of rescue efforts for Koch.

The murder charge is a Class A felony as well as the armed criminal action charge. Black has a felony DUI on his record from previous incident(s). Bond was set at \$1 million, cash only. Black remains in custody at the Pike County Jail.

All persons charged with a crime are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

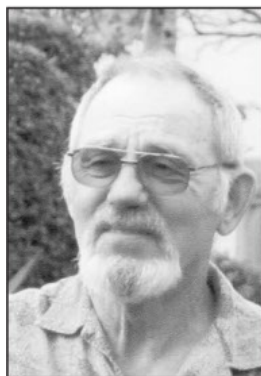

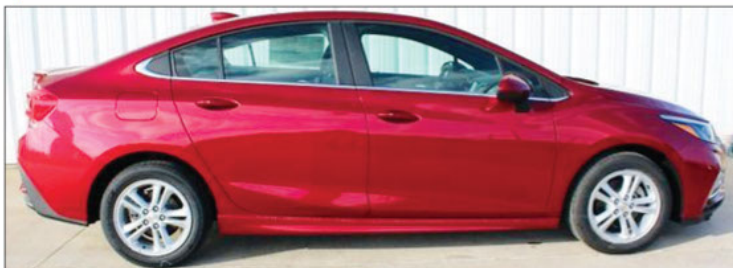
