Public Invited To Break Ground For New Champ Clark Bridge

The public is invited to celebrate the beginning of construction on a new Champ Clark Bridge. A groundbreaking ceremony will be held on Friday, Sept. 8 from 10-11 a.m., at the riverfront in Louisiana.

Several dignitaries are expected to attend the ceremony to either speak or help break ground. Incorporated into the ceremony is participation from both Missouri and Illinois, as well as local talent. "We are pleased to bring together so many people and organizations who have helped make this project a reality," said Missouri Department of Transportation Northeast District Engineer Paula Gough. "It will truly be a memorable occasion for all in the region," she continued.

According to Keith Killen, P.E., and Champ Clark Bridge project director, area residents will see construction beginning at the U.S. Route 54 and Missouri Route 79 intersection. "There will be curb, gutter and sidewalk work, as well as new lighting and pavement installed in this area," Killen said. "Although the design of the entire project will continue to be devel-

oped, we are pleased no businesses are being displaced in that area," he mentioned. The only displacement is the sign at the Ayerco convenience store. "The new bridge will tie in very close to where the old bridge does, and that construction will be at the very end of the project," he explained. He also clarified that the old bridge will stay open while the new bridge is being constructed, barring any significant safety or maintenance issues.

Project "offices" are being set up in the city so the contractor, Massman Construction Co. and MoDOT, can be on site throughout the project. "We appreciate the city working with us to determine a location and help us get set up," Killen said. He expects the offices, which are being housed in trailers, to be set up by early October.

MoDOT will provide regular updates about the project, including progress, photos and video, at www.champclarkbridge.com. On the website, individuals can sign up to receive email updates about the project.

Atkinson Competes In MO River 340 Race

Pike County native LaDon Atkinson participated in the 12th Annual Missouri River 340 race Aug. 8-11.

The MR340 is the longest non-stop river race in the world, covering 340 miles of the Missouri River. Racers enter the starting point at Kaw Point, Kansas City, Kansas, and finish the race at St. Charles, Missouri. The MR340

raises awareness for clean rivers and money raised benefits Missouri River relief projects. Currently, half of Missouri receives their drinking water from the Missouri river.

Where did Labor Day come from?

On September 5, 1882, some 10,000 workers assembled in New York City to participate in America's first Labor Day parade. After marching from City Hall to Union Square, the workers and their families gathered in Reservoir Park for a picnic, concert, and speeches. This first Labor Day celebration was initiated by Peter J. McGuire, a carpenter and labor union leader who a year earlier co-founded the Federation of Organized Trades and Labor Unions, a precursor of the American Federation of Labor.

McGuire had proposed his idea for a holiday honoring American workers at a labor meeting in early 1882. New York's Central Labor Union quickly approved his proposal and began planning events for the second Tuesday in September. McGuire had suggested a September date in order to provide a break during the long stretch between Independence Day and Thanksgiving. While the first Labor Day was held on a Tuesday, the holiday was soon moved to the first Monday in September, the date we continue to honor.

New York's Labor Day celebrations inspired similar events across the country. Oregon became the first state to grant legal status to the holiday in 1887; other states soon followed. In 1894, Congress passed legislation making Labor Day a national holiday.

For many decades, Labor Day was used by workers not only to celebrate their accomplishments, but also to air their grievances and discuss strategies for securing better working conditions and salaries. Nowadays, Labor Day is associated less with union activities and protest marches and more with leisure. For many, the holiday is a time for family picnics, sporting events, and summer's last hurrah.

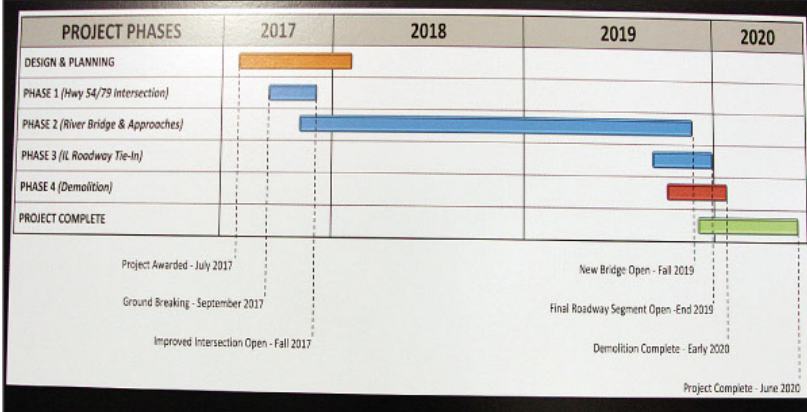

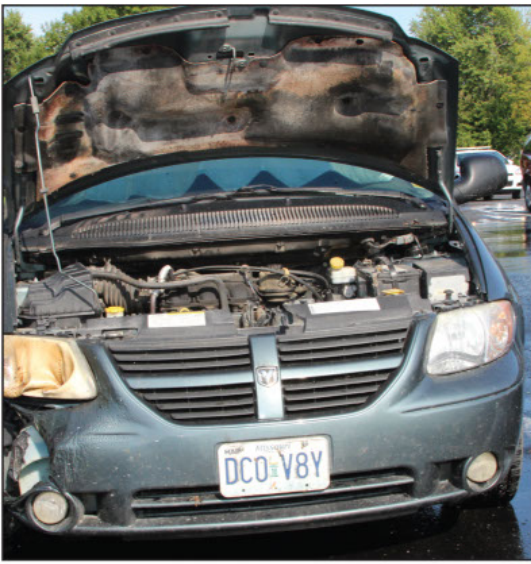

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds waterfowl hunters they have from Sept. 1 through Sept. 18 to apply online with MDC to hunt on 12 wetland areas intensively managed by the Department for waterfowl. For more information and to apply starting Sept. 1, go to mdc.mo.gov and search "Waterfowl Reservations," or apply directly at short.mdc.mo.gov/Z4V.

The reservation system allocates half of the available hunting opportunities on these areas for Missouri residents chosen through a random draw-

ing. The other half are for walk-in hunters who draw on-site each morning for the remaining spots.

MDC reminds hunters that waterfowl hunting in Missouri is influenced by habitat conditions, weather, and the timing of migrations more than overall duck and goose numbers.

"We are extremely pleased to be awarded this generous grant," said NECAC President and Chief Executive Officer Don Patrick. "NECAC has a strong record of providing a wide range of services to veterans, and this grant is one more example of how our agency can assist."

The reservation system allocates half of the available hunting opportunities on these areas for Missouri residents chosen through a random drawing. The other half

are for walk-in hunters who draw on-site each morning for the remaining spots.

MDC reminds hunters that waterfowl hunting in Missouri is influenced by habitat conditions, weather, and the timing of migrations more than overall duck and goose numbers.

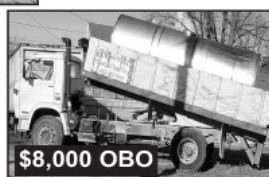

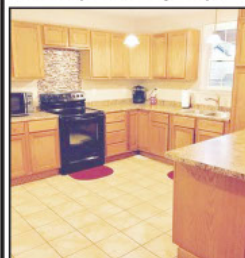

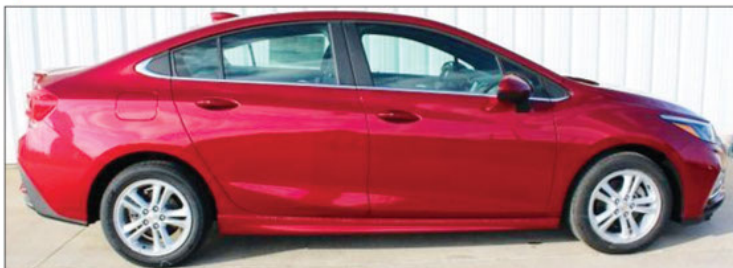
