The five-day Bicentennial celebration started on Saturday, June 30 with a parade and a weekend full of events. The event wraps up on Wednesday, July 4. The Louisiana Bicentennial celebration kicked off with a big weekend of parades, bands, demonstrations, art and much more.

The event ends tomorrow with a day of patriotic events to mark the Fourth of July. People are encouraged to come out and enjoy the festivities.

Wednesday will start with a breakfast honoring veterans at the Louisiana Elks Lodge from 7-10 a.m. and veterans can eat for free.

A silent auction of carvings by Robinson Carving Company will be held throughout the day.

At 1 p.m. the dedication of the bust of John B. Henderson will take place overlooking the Mississippi River in Henderson Riverview Park.

At 3 p.m. a Patriot Parade will take place. The parade will feature veterans, active duty military and first responders. Veterans are encouraged to ride in the parade on a float sponsored by American Legion Post 370. The parade will line up at Louisiana High School and will end at the riverfront.

Following the parade will be the National Anthem by Pam Ince and a boat "fly by" on the river which is sponsored by Fat Boys.

A ceremonial flag disposal will be sponsored by the Louisiana DAR chapter at 4:30 p.m.

Another edition of Battle of the Bands will take place at 5 p.m.

The big fireworks display will take place at the riverfront at dusk which will be followed by a lighted boat parade.

"I hope that folks will come honor our veterans and support those taking the time to honor them," noted Bicentennial Chair Cindy Blaylock.

PCMH To Host M.A.S.H. Camp For Middle School Students

Pike County Memorial Hospital will once again be hosting M.A.S.H. Camp on July 12-13 this year.

M.A.S.H. stands for the Missouri AHEC Science and Health camp. It

Cuivre River Electric Helps To Garner USDA Loan For Two New Agencies To Serve People With Disabilities

With the help of Cuivre River Electric Cooperative and the USDA's Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant program (REDLG), a \$250,000 loan to Pike County Connections (PCC) will provide startup funding for the establishment of two new nonprofit agencies that serve area citizens with developmental disabilities, and enable both jobs and benefits to be retained.

The loan for PCC is completely funded by USDA.

"Cuivre River is simply serving as the 'pass-through' organization to provide the loan to PCC," says Cuivre River Electric General Manager/CEO Doug Tracy. "No Cuivre River member monies are involved in this process."

PCC is the fundraising arm of Pike County Senate Bill 40 (PCSB40), the county entity charged with administering the funds generated by what is commonly known as Senate Bill 40 (SB40). Passed in 1969, SB40 allows individual coun-

ties in Missouri to approve a tax levy to provide needed assistance and support to persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

The organization's board was recently put in the position of having to spin off two new nonprofit agencies - Pike County Agency for Developmental Disabilities and Champ Clark Service Coordination - in order to comply with federal regulations known as Conflict Free Case Management.

However, people do have interest in the topics discussed and what information is

reconsidered in decisions made. Of the ways to secure this information other than attending the Clarksville meetings there are two easy options, one is to come to cityhall and read the approved minutes of the last meeting and the other is to go to the website and read the minutes posted there @ www.clarksvillemo.us.

The web site is also another place to see what is on the agenda of city committee meetings as well as all board of alderman meetings. Regular meeting times of the board of alderman and of city committees rarely change from the scheduled times, but if necessary and/or emergency changes must be made, the posting of that information is on the window of city hall and again on the web site.

What goes on at board of alderman meetings? Board of alderman meetings are business meetings during which time consideration by the elected board members is given to city finances, bills to be paid, approval of minutes, department reports, committee reports, items to be addressed from the last meeting and new business to be presented.

In all cases the board of alderman may take primary action to adopt or reject resolutions or ordinances, approve or reject reports and vote on any other items of business before them. Only the board of alderman can make decisions for the city. The mayor can propose, suggest and encourage adoption of a proposal, but the mayor only votes to break a tie vote. Only an alderman can make a motion and second a motion. The board of alderman is empowered by voters to collectively make decisions that are in the best interest of the city.

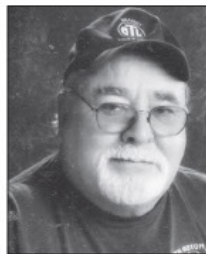

Letter To The Editor

Dear Members of the Community,

As the public health coordinator, I am reaching out to provide further information on the priority health issue that will be the focus for the Maternal and Child Health contract for FFY2019 - 2021. Many of you recently participated in a survey or group discussion to help us gain input on the issues affecting the maternal, child and infant health populations in Pike County.

Pike County Health Department took your valuable information along with local and state data and developed a three-year work plan to address the priority health issue of: Improving pre-conception, prenatal and postpartum health care services for women of childbearing age. By addressing issues surrounding maternal health we hope to impact not only our county health but also the National Outcome measures of low birth weight, preterm birth, infant mortality, perinatal mortality, neonatal mortality, preterm-related mortality and severe maternal morbidity.

Over the next three years, our goal is to improve pregnancy outcomes and reduce the incidence of prematurity and low birth weight through evidence based practices and community collaboration. Pike County Health Department has developed a work plan of activities and outcomes to create a community collaborative system for prenatal

PCMH Receives Award From State Hospital Association

Pike County Memorial Hospital was one of only eight in the state that was presented with a Most Zero Harm Award recently.

The Missouri Hospital Association (MHA), Hospital Improvement Network (HIN) announced its award winners at the HIN quality convention on June 6 in Columbia.

Jessica Stultz, Director of Clinical Quality for HIN, presented the award to PCMH's

Faulette Powelson who is the Director of Quality, Risk and Infection Control. The award was for being in the top 10 percent of all HIN participating hospitals with zero harm measures reported.



PCMH has achieved and sustained the longest duration of time without harming a patient in the most HIN areas. PCMH reports on all 11 measures applicable to the hospital. PCMH was one of the original hospitals in the HIN starting in 2012.

"Our purpose is to serve persons with developmental disabilities," according to Pete Breting, Executive Director of PCSB40. "Creating these two new agencies and funding their startup expenses put a great deal of financial stress on our board," Breting said. "The REDLG loan enabled our board to underwrite those startup costs while continuing to have funds available for needed developmental disability services."

The REDLG program provides funding for rural projects through local utility organizations. Zero-interest loans are provided to local utilities

like Cuires River, which they, in turn, pass through to local organizations (ultimate recipients) for projects that will create and retain employment in rural areas. The ultimate recipients repay the lending utility directly. The utility is then responsible for repayment to USDA. The reason that electric cooperatives are used as pass-through organizations for such community loan projects is that the co-ops often already have a financial credit history with USDA.

"This has been a 'win-win-win' for us," said Breting. "No staff lost their jobs or their benefits during the transition; persons served did not encounter any reductions or changes in their services or staff, and our board has maintained the ability to meet area

service needs and fulfill our mission in helping Pike County citizens with developmental disabilities succeed."

Tracy said that serving as the "pass-through" organization to help Pike County Connections secure this loan is one way Cuires River can support one of its members and carry out part of the co-op's mission. "We strive to magnify our position as a good citizen in the communities in and near our service area and maintain a current knowledge of governmental and other programs - like REDLG - that could benefit the membership," Tracy said. "Throughout rural America, co-ops work not only to provide value to their members but to improve the quality of life for people in their local communities."

and postpartum women that will increase social support, create supportive environments, improve risk identification, and increase linkages to resources and services to improve pregnancy outcomes. Evidence-based strategies will include education for community providers, peer group education and individual education based on identified risks. Additional strategies include building supportive relationships with prenatal and postpartum women through a community wide team-based approach to ensure linkages to resources and services.

We hope to be able to work with you as a community partner to address the needs of our maternal population. Our plan is not to replicate services, but to develop a system to make existing services more accessible to the women with identified risks and needs. Collaboration between partners could also lead to the addition of new services within our county.

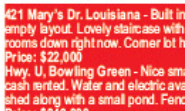

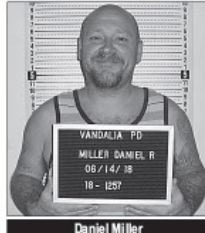
