## Vandalia Police Arrest Six In Connection With Shooting

Vandalia Police Chief Chris Hanmann says an investigation is ongoing and more charges are pending following an alleged shooting that took place last week.

So far six people have been arrested and charged in the incident.

Vandalia Police responded to a report of property damage at South School Park on Friday, July 6. It was reported a vehicle had driven through a chained and locked gate and damaged it.

According to the report, when of-

ficers arrived on scene they spoke to witnesses who said they heard a gun shot being fired then two vehicles exiting the park area at a high rate of speed. A vehicle and suspect information was developed and an investigation into the incident continued.

With the assistance of the Audrain County Sheriff's Office the victim's vehicle was located and found to have a bullet hole in it at the time it was located.

## YMCA Closes Bowling Green Pool For Training Following Incident

### Pool Reopens With Normal Hours Today

The city swimming pool in Bowling Green was closed on Monday, July 9, as YMCA staff held meetings to go over training following an incident that took place over the weekend.

Emergency services were called on Saturday after a two-year-old boy fell into the pool and was submerged. YMCA Executive Director Marsha Garrison said staff called EMS and the boy was cleared at the site. He was released to a family member following the incident.

"Patron safety is our first priority," Garrison noted. "We want people to enjoy their experience at the pool."

She added that she decided to close the facility for a day so the staff could go over all safety measures and do some additional training.

The pool generally has a manager, an assistant manager and three certified lifeguards on staff at the pool at all times. Garrison pointed out that during times of low usage, one staff member may be released from duty.

She noted that all staff must receive certification that includes classroom and skills classes, along with learning various life-saving techniques.

"We are well-prepared and ready for anything that can happen."

Garrison reminds patrons that all children under eight-years-old must be accompanied by a parent or adult in supervisory capacity. Children must be in arm reach of an adult at all times.

The city pool is operated every year by YMCA staff. Normal hours resume today (Tuesday, July 10).

artist John Stoeckley, Louisiana Mayor Marvin Brown and State Rep. Jim Hansen. There was also a dramatic and moving performance of slave life in Missouri by Lindenwood University adjunct professor Angela da Silva.

## Beauchamp Speaks To Pike County Republicans

Republicans of Pike County met Thursday, July 5 at Faith Baptist Church in Louisiana. Wayne Knipmeyer gave the blessing and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. All enjoyed a carry-in meal.

President Gale Frolos called the meeting to order. The secretary and treasurer's reports were made and approved. Guests introduced were Greg and Margaret Owens and Larry and Susan Beauchamp.

Beauchamp gave some background on the work of the 911 committee. If passed 911 would be governed by a seven man board selected initially by the County Commissioners and thereafter elected on a four year rotating system. The 911 system would be funded by a nine-sixteenth cent sales tax. He felt the system did not need a million dollar building, just a suitable place. He asked for our support.

In old business volunteer workers for the booth at the fair were selected. It was also voted to give away a gas card in a drawing during fair week.

Frolos attended the state GOP committee meeting where they passed three resolutions: Support Proposition A, have a closed state primary, and condemn the Clean Missouri Constitutional Initiative.

She also stated the National RNC executive committee voted to endorse Josh Hawley for senator so the Missouri State Party will release funds for Hawley's campaign. There was some objection to this.

Candidates present and speaking briefly were Chris Kunza Mennemeyer, Milan Berry and Pat Flynn. Also present and speaking briefly about work going on in their offices were Sheriff Steve Korte, Commissioners Justin Shepard and Bill Allen.

Representative Jim Hansen who doesn't have an opponent this election said he is still going to events, walking in parades and was privileged to speak at the Henderson bust unveiling at the Louisiana Bicentennial.

## Cuivre River Electric Achieves An Overall ACSI Of 86 From '18 Annual Member Satisfaction Survey

Cuivre River's 23rd Annual Member Satisfaction Survey, conducted earlier in 2018 resulted in an overall ACSI (American Customer Satisfaction Index) score of 86, among the highest scores in the country. The ACSI is one of several benchmarks included in Cuivre River's annual survey project that provides a unique opportunity to compare Cuivre River to other utilities, as well as other industries.

"Member satisfaction is paramount," said General Manager/CEO Doug Tracy. "As a cooperative, we exist to serve our members' needs and work to meet or exceed their expectations. Our first priority every day is to do it well, and with gratitude for their support," he said.

The survey was composed of 20 questions, including the four questions developed for the American Customer Satisfaction Index (ACSI) that focused on the following attributes. Members rated each on a scale of one to 10, with 10 representing the ideal score:

1. Overall satisfaction (9.03)
2. Meeting expectations (8.40)
3. Ideal utility company (8.65)
4. Would choose Cuivre River (9.01)

Additional questions were asked about electric service attributes and perceptions of the cooperative's performance in several other areas.

Reliability was noted as the top service priority, as chosen by 61 percent of Cuivre River members who participated in this year's survey. When asked about reliability, 91% of those who responded noted their service was "very reliable."

Affordability ranked as the second chief concern among 35 percent of survey respondents. Environmental qualities were in third place as the main concern for the remaining four percent of members responding.

The survey was conducted by Inside Information, an independent research organization in Smithville, Mo. A randomly selected group of co-op residential members were polled by using a hybrid strategy to obtain responses by phone and online. Results have a margin of error of +/- 4.9 percent and a 95 percent probability.

## Emergency Blood Shortage; Blood Supply Dwindles

Check Out Ways To Help, Where To Donate

An emergency blood shortage is prompting the American Red Cross to issue an urgent call for eligible donors of all blood types - especially type O - to give now and help save lives.

The Red Cross escalated its call for blood and platelet donors after a difficult Independence Day week for donations. More than 550 fewer blood drives were organized by businesses and other community groups last week than during a typical week as individuals across the country celebrated the holiday and enjoyed summer activities. This could equate to as many as 15,000 fewer donations than needed, causing donations to now be distributed to hospitals faster than they come in.

"Each and every day, individuals across the country depend on blood and platelet donations for lifesaving treatments and emergency care, so it's critical that people donate now to meet these needs," said Cliff Numark, senior vice president, Red Cross Blood Services. "Whether you've never donated or give a couple of times a year, you're needed to give as soon as possible to help save patient lives. Yours may be the do-

nation a patient is counting on."

This need is especially critical for type O blood donors. Type O is the most in-demand blood type and often the first to be depleted from hospital shelves during a shortage. Type O negative is the universal blood type and what emergency room personnel reach for when there is no time to determine the blood type of patients in the most serious situations. Type O positive is the most common blood type and can be transfused to Rh-positive patients of any blood type.

How to help  
To schedule an appointment to donate, use the free Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org or call 1-800-RED-CROSS (1-800-733-2767). The Red Cross has added about 6,500 additional appointment slots at donation centers and community blood drives across the country over the next few weeks to accommodate more donors. Donation appointments and completion of a RapidPass online health history questionnaire are encouraged to help reduce the time it takes to donate.

## Discover Nature With MDC At Free Catfish Clinic Aug. 18

Join the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) for an exciting catfishing experience on the Mississippi River. MDC invites families to discover nature at a free catfish clinic at Ted Shanks and DuPont Reservation conservation areas in northeast Missouri on Saturday, Aug. 18.

The clinic will begin at 8 a.m. with basic instruction on setline fishing techniques, including a hands-on tutorial on how to safely set trotlines and bank poles, property label equipment, and handle and release fish. Following a river outing, participants will attend seminars on catfish biology led by an MDC biologist, and river fishing regulations led by a conservation agent, including a how-to presentation on using equipment.

"This is a great opportunity for families to enjoy the outdoors together," said MDC Outdoor Skills Specialist Rob Garver. "Parents will learn right alongside their kids the ins and outs of river fishing for big cats. Biologists will be there to help the participants understand the life of the catfish, and MDC conservation agents will be there to help them understand the rules and regulations of catfishing.

There are many methods for

catching catfish, making this program a learning experience for both new and veteran anglers."

MDC offers Discover Nature programs to help adults and children explore nature and master outdoor skills together. The Discover Nature: Catfish Clinic is free and open to ages 10 and older. All participants younger than 65 years old must possess a valid fishing permit, and participants ages 16 years and younger must be accompanied by an adult. "Welcome to what is truly a historic occasion, honoring a brilliant man who 105 years after his death is getting a bit of the recognition he certainly deserves," Engel remarked as he opened the ceremony.

He noted that Henderson was a teacher, attorney and senator who helped draft the 13th Amendment abolishing slavery among his long list of accomplishments.

"He championed women's voting rights at a time when many thought that females should just stay home. He argued for working with Native Americans when few wanted to do so. He prosecuted federal tax cheats, even when it meant coming close to a White House occupied by a President from his own party. And he voted against convicting a President from the opposite party of impeachment charges, telling those who sought to bribe him that principle outweighed politics no matter the personal cost," Engel said. "Of course, Henderson wasn't perfect. But he wasn't wish-washy either, saying one thing and doing another."

Engel added that people should remember they have the power to address the wrong and promote the right.

"And may John Brooks Henderson's name be associated forever with Freedom."

The process of developing the bust of Henderson was a long one. Local artist John Stoeckley discussed the process as he addressed the crowd. He noted that he worked from a couple of photos and that a couple of local folks, the Rev. Art Moore and Gregg Blaylock, posed in period clothing to develop details for the bust.

"I'm very, very proud to present it to our community," Stoeckley remarked through tears.

State Rep. Jim Hansen offered re-

marks at the dedication along with Louisiana Mayor Marvin Brown.

It was noted that Henderson RiverView Park already has a memorial that was erected in 1998 by the Louisiana Rotary Club. That project was spearheaded by Betty Allen.

Lindenwood University adjunct professor Angela da Silva offered the dramatic performance, "Lila, a Missouri Slave" for the audience and took questions afterward.

The Henderson bust sits atop a rock column that features three plaques.

The plaque on the front of the column memorializes Henderson's life, Nov. 16, 1826-April 12, 1913.

John Brooks Henderson was born in Virginia and moved with his family to Lincoln County, Missouri when he was six years old. By age 10, he was an orphan.

Henderson overcame what could have been a life of obscurity to be a Pike County teacher, lawyer, and state legislator. He lived and worked in Louisiana, and was the first president of the Bank of Louisiana. During the early part of the Civil War, he served as a brigadier general in Missouri's Union militia.

In 1862, Henderson was appointed a U.S. Senator and within six weeks of arriving in Washington, he began regular meetings with President Abraham Lincoln.

Though a one-time slave owner himself, Henderson in 1864 drafted and introduced the 13th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution outlawing human bondage - the first time the nation's founding document had been altered in 60 years.

Henderson also was a strong campaigner for women's voting rights, supported better relations with Native Americans, fought against federal government corruption, was one of only seven Republicans who voted to acquit Democrat President Andrew Johnson of impeachment charges, and played a

role in the temperance movement.

Land for the park you are in was donated by Henderson and his wife, Mary Foote Henderson, to the City of Louisiana in May 1903. They are buried in Green-Wood Cemetery, Brooklyn, Kings County New York, along with the son, John Brooks Henderson Jr.

While Henderson was a strict constitutionalist, he embraced changes that would lead to a more equitable nation. The maverick served at times as a Republican and a Democrat, but spent people of all parties.

Henderson realized what made America unique, and understood perhaps the most meaningful principle of its democracy - those in power rule only at the behest of the greater voting masses. His words still echo across the ages.

"If you commit errors, or outrage public sentiment, I want no other revolution than the right of the ballot box. With the Constitution unimpaired, we may yet appeal to the popular heart for the approval of right and the redress of wrong."

There are two plaques on the back of the column. The top plaque notes the sculpture was conceived and created by Louisiana artist John Stoeckley and that Pike County historian Brent Engel provided the wording.

The other plaque offers the 13th Amendment.

"Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction.

Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation."

Following the dedication there was a patriotic parade down Georgia Street and a ceremony with a flag disposal at the riverfront. Fireworks closed out the five-day event.

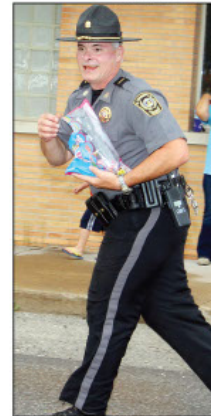

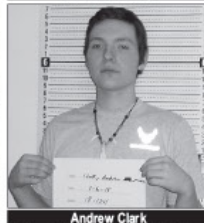

Who blood donations help Because of generous donors, the Red Cross is able to provide blood products for patients like 9-month-old Krew Anderson. Krew is a happy, laid-back baby boy. His wide grin frames two tiny teeth. He likes to play with balloons and just experienced his first boat ride and fireworks show, but Krew has faced more challenges in the last four months than many people will experience in a lifetime.

In March, Krew was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia, a type of cancer that causes bone marrow to produce a large number of abnormal blood cells. Since then, he has gone through four rounds of chemotherapy and received 15 blood and platelet transfusions to date.

"The first time he got [a transfusion], I was just super nervous and didn't know really what was happening," said his mother, Stephanie Anderson. "Now, when he gets one, I'm like, 'Yes, please, get him some blood to help him get more energy and back to normal.'"

Krew's father, Richard Anderson, donated blood a couple of times a year prior to his son's diagnosis, but after seeing Krew receive blood, he now plans to give as soon as he's eligible again.

"For me, just knowing that if it happened to me, it can happen to anyone. I want to make sure there's enough blood out there for everyone, and that there's no shortage," he said.

Missing Types sees encouraging increase in new donors - all donors needed now

Facing a decline of about 80,000 new Red Cross blood donors each year for the past several years, the Red Cross launched the Missing Types campaign in June to encourage new donors, and those who have not given recently, to donate blood. While the campaign has already inspired thousands of new donors to give, the Red Cross is now calling on all eligible blood and platelet donors to roll up a sleeve as soon as possible to overcome the emergency blood shortage.

Through the Missing Types campaign, which runs throughout the summer, the letters A, B and O - letters used to identify blood types - disappeared from corporate logos, celebrity social media accounts and favorite websites to illustrate the critical role every blood donor plays in ensuring blood is never missing from hospital shelves.
