

Waters Furniture Company has been operating in Vandalia for over 125 years. Following a liquidation sale, the Vandalia landmark will close its doors. The business has 10 buildings till of merchandise in Vandalia, including the one above on State Street At of the buildings have been obsed in preparation for the sale that officially begins on Friday Aug 10. Store o-owner Chris Watson said invitations have been sent in the mail to individuals to come check out marked-down items beginning on Wednesday, Aug 8. 



It is also not known at this time what the future will be for the 10 buildings in Vandalia that house merchandise for Waters Fumiture. Watson stressed the decision to close Waters was not a sudden one. "We have been discussing for five to seven years when the right time to consolidate would be," he remarked. "We had the same merchandise in Hannibal and Wandalia. The same sofias, the same bedroom sets, we had two of everything."

He noted the company will continue to service everything that has been purchased at Waters Fumiture through the Hannibal and Bowling Green stores.

through the Hannbal and Bowling Green stores. Watson said there will be at least 33 million worth of merchandise available in the liquidation sale, which includes items in the 10 buildings. He noted that some extra inventory that had already been pur-chased by the company will be brought in as well for liquidation.

brought in as well for liquication.

The sale officially begins on Friday, Aug. 10 at 10 a.m. However, Watson noted that a "private" sale will start on Wednesday, Aug. 8. He said invitations were sent as mailers. "Obviously if someone comes in on Wednesday no one is going to ell them they can't come in."

Watson said a professional sales company was hired to help with the liquidation sale. He said it is anticipated Waters will remain open another 66-90 days until the conclusion of that sale, but may close sooner depending on how the sale goes.

A BIT OF HISTORY

to a Vandalia history book it remains one of the worst Fires ever in the town. The smell of gas had been de-tected three days prior but the source couldn't be found. The ex-plosion occurred at 12:45 p.m. ad claimed another building and dam-aged several others.

Vandalia's Fire Department was aided by Perry, Mexico and Bowl-ing Green. Fire fighters were placed on roofs of nearby buildings and people came to retrieve money and safe deposit box contents at a nearby bank. Flams reportedly reached higher than the water tower and smoke could be seen for miles in every direction. Volunteers are even prictured manning fire hoses to help with the disaster. 

Four Arrested For Tampering, Trespassing
